At Chicago Aerial Industries they met and talked with Leonard Barwick, personnel manager, who stated that they accepted all types of people at Chicago Aerial. At present they employ eight colored people out of eleven hundred employees. They also make it a policy to employ the handicapped.

At the American Can Co. they saw Howard Banjamin and Mr. Pearce, director of employment. This plant presently employs two or three

negroes who live in Maywood and Evanston.

At Barco they interviewed the manager and vice president, Mr. Heyworth. At present they employ no negroes but they have in the past who employed one, who was treated very cordially by fellow workers. Barco would welcome qualified people of any color.

The question came up again, should the Commission press for an open housing ordinance for Barrington?

Mr. Lipofsky said, " In all common decency to our fellow human beings we ought to have an open housing ordinance,"

Mr. Anderson appointed a committee of three to investigate present ordinances in Illinois, Mr. Papadakis, Mr. Lipofsky, and Mrs. Wilder.

Father Dressler and Mrs. Gayer were asked to investigate the kind of housing that is available for Mexicans who live in Barrington. Rev. Olson said he had photographs of substandard housing and outhouses within the village limits. Mr. McLean suggested we meet with the real estate people again. In response to a question about the number of Jewishpeople in the area, Mr. Lipofsky thought there were six families in the village and seven or eight in the Barrington Hills. INQUIRIES FROM AUDIENCE: At'y Thomas Johnson on behalf of Kennedy Dev. Co stated their case re sewer and water hook-on fees in Fox Point. It was noted Item #24 on Agenda would refer to this. Atty Johnson stated Kennedy Dev. Co. had 18 contracts underway for houses contracted for under old rates; asked consideration at this time Reference was made to their letter of 12-21-67 to Village Manager. General discussion had. Trustee Capulli preferred decision be made when full Board present. This seemed agreeable. MOTION Trustee Voss to concur with recommendation of Plan Commission to approve and that proper Village officials be authorized to sign plat; 2nd Trustee Hollister. Roll call Ayes: Capulli, Shultz, Voss, Hollister, Kaiser.

110 E. STATION ST. PARKING LOT: Manager Heninger reported Mr. Millin, Architect, is to submit drawing for proposed lights; in meantime 2 gas lights will be installed at entrance; it was thought perhaps a center post will be necessary for adequate lot lighting.

WYNGATE UNIT #1: Sanitary Water Board approved permit to install and operate a system of 8" sanitary sewers in area south of Main St. west of Ela Rd. with outlet to existing sanitary sewers in Fox Point Unit 6 tributary to the treatment plant under date of 12-22-67. Manager Heninger reported that Consoer, Townsend & Assoc. will compile amount of acreage and when recorded Treasurer Zelsdorf will write Wyngate subdivider with regard to recovery ordinance fees. Letter from Village Engineers asks that \$1000. be deposited with Village in escrow to cover their review of plans. When funds have been received the plat will be signed & recorded-President

SANITARY SEWER INFILTRATION: Interim report received tonight from Consoer, Townsend & Assoc. dated 12-27-67, for areas north of Main St. as described. Report on Summit & Russell sewer area to be reported on later. President preferred that report just received be studied by Trustees, Manager & himself.

AMENDMENT TO LIQUOR ORDINANCE: Trustee Voss noted this comes up with another matter further down on Agenda and felt it should be discussed with item #27.

**SOCIAL SECURITY OFFICE:** Letter of appreciation received for office supplied the Waukegan branch from which to handle their business in this area.

TRAFFIC SEMINAR FOR POLICE DEPT.: Manager Heninger and Chief Muscarello have discussed this but no commit ment received from Barrington Hills; Chief has contacted Mr. Hayward Matter to come up later.

ILL. MUNICIPAL LEAGUE: President reported that rates for membership in 1968 will be raised and distributed a resume of populations and rates for other area Villages

1968 TAXICAB LICENSES: Chief Muscarello expects service for next year to be much improved; has already checked out 4 licenses for Babb with 1 more to come in and he is watching this assignment closely.

ORDINANCE #1000: "No Parking on Hough St." as described: this was passed sometime ago and reconsidered and is still held. Bob Tichy of Barton Stationers asked if it could be clarified; it was read. It was explained to business people from area of Hough & Main Sts who were present that removal of parking meters was a stipulation by the State during negotiations carried on for improvement planned for traffic flow and installation eventually of improved lights for control. During discussion Charlene Thompson of Bob & Betty explained some of the difficulties and stated she has under lease from the Railway the strip of land north of her building which she has been advised could accommodate 30 to 40 cars if well organized.

It was suggested that perhaps State could be approached on their feeling of permitting parking in area on Hough St during limited specified hours. Trustee
Capulli suggested this matter go back to Manager and Chief of Police for further
study. Mrs. Thompson assured Board she and other business people are more than
willing to cooperate toward a solution of their parking problems. It was agreed
matter go to Manager Heninger for further study.

SEWER & WATER FEES-CUTOFF DATE: Michael Graft, builder, stated the Kennedy Co. was not only one affected by changes in rates, explaining his situation with regard to building permit fees. Trustee Voss assured everyone there was no intention to favor any one builder. Discussion. It seemed agreed that a cut-off date should be set and if necessary the builders may be asked to submit affidavits to substantiate claims for relief. Atty. Tornquist said the effective date for Ord. #1003 is Jan. 1,1968 but Board could provide for old fees to be in effect to a certain date if they desire. Discussion during which Atty. Tornquist was asked to draw a resolution or motion to cover exceptions that have been presented in building department. Trustee Shultz reminded that this ordinance was passed to bring needed revenue to Village and this should be considered. MOTION Trustee Shultz: I MOVE that the Village Board concurs with the recommendation of fits Legal Consultant that the water and sewer connection fees are payable at the rates in effect at the time of connections and, therefore, fees will be payable for all connections made to water and sewer mains. so as to receive service from or through such mains, after January 1, 1968 at the new rates established by Ordinance No. 1003 unless a building permit application was filed with this Village on or before December 15, 1967. 2nd Trustee Capulli. Roll call-Ayes: Capulli, Shultz, Hollister, Kaiser. Noes: Voss. Atty. asked to draw a further draft motion intended to give relief.

PARK DIST. BLDG. PERMIT: Manager Heninger reviewed action taken in 1961 on a permit for the District on which building and plumbing fees were waived by the Board if Park Board was paying fees. If this to be done now it requires Board action. Discussion; noted evidence is required if Park Board is paying fees. Trustee Kaiser MOTIONED this be handled the same way as in 1961; 2nd Trustee Capulli. Roll call-Ayes: Capulli. Shultz. Voss. Hollister. Kaiser.

FOX POINT 1st ADDITION TO UNITS 5 & 6: Copies of plats therefor presented. MOTION Trustee Voss that this matter be referred to Plan Commission for hearing in accordance with law; 2nd Trustee Kaiser. Ayes.

LIQUOR ORD. AMENDMENT: Ordinance amending Chapter 13 of Municipal Code of 1957 read. Trustee Capulli asked if Liquor Commissioner had any comments? President Blanke said this infringes upon rights of Liquor Commissioner under statutes of State of Illinois and that he had asked Board to consider adding one space to the Liquor License Ordinance; gave verbal statement of his feelings; desires to evaluate matter further; asked why Chief of Police should be burdened with administration of this ordinance? Discussion on #13 of amendment. It was noted Legal Consultant had been asked to draft ordinance after checking with other municipalities. MOTION Trustee Voss to adopt ordinance as read; 2nd Trustee Capulli. Roll call-Ayes: Capulli, Shultz, Voss, Kaiser, NOES: Hollister. #1008.

ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPT. 4-ART.V111-MUNICIPAL CODE:was read. MOTION to adopt by Trustee Capulli; 2nd Trustee Shultz. Roll call-Ayes:Capulli, Shultz, Voss, Hollister, Kaiser. #1009. (Purchases by Village Manager)

CIVIL DEFENSE COMMENDATION received from Village of Lake Zurich for help given them during last April's tornado.

NW MUNICIPAL CONFERENCE ANNUAL MEETING: Manager Reninger reported dinner meeting Wed.Jan. 24,1968 at Old Orchard Country Club, Arlington Hts. to which all elected officers, spouses and others are invited; reservations due by Jan. 22nd at \$5.75 per person. Manager noted that most other municipalities purchase such tickers for their people. Any one interested contact Manager in ample time. Trustee Voss favored doing this - agreed.

WYNGATE: Mr. Decker stated he received letter requesting \$1000. escrow payment for plan exam by Consoer, Townsend & Assoc. which he deposited. Asked about establishing acreage for amount due under the recovery ordinance and was advised this will be compiled by Village Engineers and he will be informed of amount due. Discussion.

SPEC. ASSESSMENT #74: Letter received by Manager from Gilbert W. Willey of 152
Kainer Ave. read. It was questioned why such a letter or matter needed to come before
Board. Manager Heninger will administer this matter.

#4WELL SITE: Manager Heninger received proposal from J.P.Miller Attesian Well Co. in amt. \$1125. It was reported proposal will be accepted tomorrow.
