

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In the midst of a lengthy political campaign, matters of public policy that are also moral issues sometimes are misrepresented or are presented in a partial or manipulative fashion. While everyone could be expected to know the Church's position on the immorality of abortion and the role of law in protecting unborn children, it seems some profess not to know it and others, even in the Church, dispute it. Since this teaching has recently been falsely presented, the following clarification may be helpful.

The Catholic Church, from its first days, condemned the aborting of unborn children as gravely sinful. Not only Scripture's teaching about God's protection of life in the womb (consider the prophets and the psalms and the Gospel stories about John the Baptist and Jesus himself in Mary's womb) but also the first century catechism (the Didache or Teaching of the Twelve Apostles) said: "You shall not slay the child by abortions. You shall not kill what is generated." The teaching of the Church was clear in a Roman Empire that permitted abortion. This same teaching has been constantly reiterated in every place and time up to Vatican II, which condemned abortion as a "heinous crime." This is true today and will be so tomorrow. Any other comments, by politicians, professors, pundits or the occasional priest, are erroneous and cannot be proposed in good faith.

This teaching has consequences for those charged with caring for the common good, those who hold public office. The unborn child, who is alive and is a member of the human family, cannot defend himself or herself. Good law defends the defenseless. Our present laws permit unborn children to be privately killed. Laws that place unborn children outside the protection of law destroy both the children killed and the common good, which is the controlling principle of Catholic social teaching. One cannot favor the legal status quo on abortion and also be working for the common good.

This explains why the abortion issue will not disappear and why it is central to the Church's teaching on a just social order. The Church does not endorse candidates for office, but she does teach the principles according to which Catholics should form their social consciences. The teaching, which covers intrinsic evils such as abortion and many other issues that are matters of prudential judgment, could not be clearer; the practice often falls short because we are all sinners. There is no room for self-righteousness in Catholic moral teaching.

The Conference of Bishops in this country and the Bishops of Illinois have issued statements about Catholic social teaching and political life. They are available in our parishes. All of us should keep our country and all the candidates for office in the next election in our prayers. God bless you and your families.

To Carry Out God's Plan

Once upon a time there was a group of orphans who worked hard at various tasks but remained impoverished because they had no parent to guide them. They fought among themselves and struggled to control the meager possessions they held. Try as they might, they could not trust one another and constantly struggled for dominance over the rickety old house in which they lived. The more they clashed with one another, the less time they had to improve the dwelling they all shared. In fact, the home itself suffered to such an extent that it was on the verge of collapse. All of them had plans and ideas about how the house could be repaired. Each of the thoughts had a certain merit, but none were tried because of the constant bickering between the orphans. Finally, while hiding one day in the basement, the youngest orphan found the original plans for the house and manual of repairs. The youngster was awestruck at the beauty he saw and amazed by the vision of the architect. He was impressed by the simplicity and clarity of the manual. He understood that he held in his hands the solution to the pressing problems and the key to a better life. That night, as the orphans gathered at table, the youngster brought forth his precious find, though frightened and uncertain. He did not know what the outcome would be but, with courage, he presented it to the others. At once, the others saw the wisdom of the plans and the beauty of what could be accomplished, but they still lacked the leadership to do anything about it. Their mutual hurts and frustrations still prevented them from doing what needed to be done. In their rage, they became hostile towards the youngster who brought out of the cellar the answers they needed. As a result nothing changed in the orphans' lives.

Weekend after weekend, we will hear the vision and truth of God as captured in the words of the prophets, apostles, and evangelists. These men continue to bring forth the hidden plans of God. Realizing that they were called to be God's spokespersons, their words convey an invaluable treasure for us. Will we recognize how they apply to our own lives? Will we follow them? We are all part of God's family even if we, at times, feel orphaned and abandoned. Because we are a part of the family of God, we have the potential of following the Creator's great design and build a world, a Church, a parish or a family worthy of the Divine architect. Unlike the orphans in the story, we can carry out God's plan and, in the process, harmony and love will grow between us, past hurts forgotten and in each day we will be renewed.

GENERATIONS OF FAITH 2008-2009

Generations of Faith is gearing up for the beginning of our events this year. Our topic is Sacraments and our first session is a Sacrament overview where we will examine the changes that Vatican II has introduced in the way we think and talk about our Sacraments. For those of you who are new to **Generations of Faith**, I thought I would inform you of what to expect at the session.

As you arrive at the Parish Center, you will stop at a table at the north end where you will pick up your family's name tags. If you are only attending one session and need to pay (by cash or check only), you will be directed to another table in the same area. If you are preparing for Confirmation, you will sign in at a table immediately to the left of the door as you enter the Parish Center. Remember that the event starts at 6:00 p.m. on **Tuesday, September 9th, Wednesdays, September 10th and 17th, and Friday, September 12th**; 9:00 a.m. on **Saturday, September 13th**; and 7:00 p.m. on **Monday, September 15th. Please be on time!**

All sessions start with a meal. You will be seated by our Maitre d'extraordinaire, Fr. Tom Bishop. As soon as the table is filled, you will receive your food. Please say grace and begin eating. The tables will be cleared of all food items 30 minutes after the start time of the session.

There will be an opening prayer and an introduction to the topic. Then people will be directed to their age-appropriate learning sessions: ages 0 to 3 go to the nursery; ages 4, 5 and kindergarten together; grades 1 and 2; grades 3, 4 and 5; middle school; high school; and adults.

Afterwards you will return to the Parish Center gym for faith sharing, evaluation and the closing prayer.

Accessibility: the St. Anne campus is wheelchair-accessible. If you have any other special needs, such as large print or a sign-language interpreter, please contact the **Generations of Faith** office and speak to **Carla Czyzewski** at **847.620.3069** at least 72 hours before the beginning of the session you are attending.

GENERATIONS OF FAITH 2008-2009

Dr. Jose M. de Mesa: Saturday morning and Monday night speaker

I am pleased to announce that the Monday night *Generations of Faith* session on **September 15th**, starting at 7:00 p.m., will include a lecture and question and answer period by the esteemed theologian Dr. Jose de Mesa. Dr. de Mesa is a Filipino married lay theologian. He is a University Fellow at De La Salle University and a professor of applied theology at the Inter-Congregational Theological Center in Quezon City, Philippines. A former dean at Maryhill School of Theology and former resident faculty at the East Asian Pastoral Institute, Dr. de Mesa holds an M.A. and Ph.D. in Religious Studies from the Catholic University of Louvain in Belgium. He is also a member of the ecumenical and inter-faith group of communicators based in Bangkok, Thailand, the Asian Communication Network. Dr. de Mesa is in Chicago as the Visiting Luzbetak Professor of Mission and Culture at the Catholic Theological Union. He has authored a number of books, the latest being *"Why Theology is Never Far From Home," "The Prayer Our Lord Taught Us"* and, just published this year, *"Bakas: Retrieving the Sense of Sacramentality of the Ordinary."*

In order that those with children who are unable to attend the Monday night session can also hear the professional theologian, I am trying to arrange for the speaker to also present for one other session in a series. **For the first event, Dr. de Mesa will also speak on Saturday morning. If you are already attending another session with your family and would also like to hear the speaker,** you are invited to come at 8:00 p.m. on Monday or 10:00 a.m. on Saturday.

MINISTRY OPPORTUNITIES

At *Generations of Faith* we come together to share a meal and then to share our traditions and our faith. We come away refreshed and enriched by the experience. This cannot happen without the help of many dedicated ministers giving their time, talents and efforts to their fellow parishioners. Our heartfelt thanks goes to all those who have committed themselves to this ministry for the coming year. If you would like to join the *Generations of Faith* ministry team, we still have opportunities available in the following areas:

Meal Service: Set up beverages, serve family-style meals, and clean up.

A/V and Session Operations: Assist with setting up the breakout rooms, deliver session materials to breakout rooms, or operate audio/visual equipment.

Art and Environment: Set-up tables in the Parish Center prior to the start of a session, or bring home tablecloths to launder, fold and return within 48 hours.

Catechists: Scripts are provided to teach, or assist a catechist, at the following levels: pre-school (ages 4 to kindergarten), grades 1-2, grades 3-5, high school, or adults.

Babysitting: Watch children (infants through 3 year olds) in the nursery.

Hospitality: Greet participants or usher them to their tables. Ministers are still needed for the Saturday team only.

The time requirement for most teams is 1½-2 hours per each session plus 1½-2 hours practice the week prior to the beginning of each series.

High School students: Helping with *Generations of Faith* is a great way to complete your school's service requirement.



Spiritus (for Freshman and Sophomores)




Human beings were made for greatness. We were made to know God, know truth, and live life in a way that brings us peace and happiness. As a result, it is perhaps harder to live as a teenager today than at any other time before. Pope John Paul II, in his "*Theology of the Body*," challenges us to think about ourselves differently. By helping us understand the profound interconnection between sex and the Christian mystery, John Paul II's "*Theology of the Body*" paves the way for lasting renewal and enables us all to rediscover "the meaning of the whole existence, the meaning of life!" As you begin to consider your life beyond high school, it may be a good time to think about these issues and consider this as a possible way of life. Our time together will seek to provide a road map to real love and authentic happiness. We will challenge the misguided teachings of the modern culture and consider a new understanding of the human person that takes one beyond the "thou shall nots" often associated with Christianity to a fresh new approach to the gift of love and human sexuality.





23rd Sunday of the Year, 2008 (127A)

First Reading: Ezekiel 33:7-9 (NJB)

The word of the Lord came to me:

⁷ "Son of man I have appointed you as watchman for the House of Israel.

When you hear a word from my mouth, warn them from me.

⁸ "If I say to someone wicked,

'Evil-doer, you are to die,'

and you do not speak to warn the wicked person to renounce such ways,
the wicked person will die for this guilt,

but I shall hold you responsible for the death.

⁹ "If, however, you do warn someone wicked to renounce such ways and repent,

and that person does not repent, then the culprit will die for this guilt,

but you yourself will have saved your life."

Psalm 95:1-2, 6-7, 8-9. *If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts.*

Second Reading: Romans 13:8-10 (USCCB)

Brothers and sisters:

⁸ Owe nothing to anyone, except to love one another;

for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law.

⁹ The commandments,

"You shall not commit adultery; you shall not kill;

you shall not steal; you shall not covet,"

and whatever other commandment there may be,

are summed up in this saying, namely,

"You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

¹⁰ Love does no evil to the neighbor;

hence, love is the fulfillment of the law.

Gospel: Matthew 18:15-20 (CCCB)

Jesus spoke to the disciples:

¹⁵ "If your brother or sister sins against you,

go and point out the fault when the two of you are alone.

If the brother or sister listens to you, you have regained that one.

¹⁶ "But if you are not listened to, take one or two others along with you,

so that every word may be confirmed by the evidence of two or three wit-

nesses.

¹⁷ "If the brother or sister refuses to listen to them,

tell it to the church;

and if the offender refuses to listen even to the church,

let such a one be to you as a Gentile and a tax collector.

¹⁸ "Truly I tell you,

whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven,

and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven.

¹⁹ Again, truly I tell you,

if two of you agree on earth about anything you ask,

it will be done for you by my Father in heaven.

²⁰ For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them."

Living Story

The gospel pericopes (lectionary passages) for the 23rd and 24th Sundays are a continuous homily to the community on reconciliation (vv. 15-20 and 21-35). Recall the pericope two Sundays ago (16:13-) in which Jesus tells Peter that he will give him the keys and that the Father would uphold whatever Peter bound or loosed on earth. I had said that such a responsibility would also be given to the entire community; it is at verse 18 today. Also note that collegiality is reinforced at v.19 (*you* is plural here).

Once more, it is helpful to see this pericope in cultural terms rather than, say, a legal sense. It is about opening the heart and listening; it is about conflict resolution, as we say today. Matthew gives three strategies to avoid conflict rather than engage in an escalating spiral of reprisal.

v. 15. **Confrontation.** Conflict arises because sin is inherently an offense between persons. In cultures where **honor/shame** is a core value, it is easy to sin, that is, to offend another's honor; defense of that honor can eventuate in death of the offender. [Jesus always attacks the "eye for an eye" mind-set.] If one confronts the sinner when the two are alone, then the matter is private, out of the public eye, and honor/shame is engaged at the lowest level. No one "loses face" if the perception of dishonor is a mistaken one, or if the alleged offense is unintentional, and it can then be said that *you have regained that one*.

v. 16. **Negotiation.** If the alleged offender does not listen, then take along one or two others. The reproof is "semi-private" and is now a legal matter requiring more than one witness. (Matthew's audience would certainly remember the harshness at Deuteronomy 17:6, but read the whole piece there about "law," vv. 1-7.) The witnesses are fully aware of the gravity of their role (Exodus 20:16, the 10 commandments) and the consequence of bearing false witness (Deut. 19:18). Whatever they decide is "legally binding." Negotiators might succeed where individual efforts fail and honor would be restored in order to avoid the next step.

v.17. **Adjudication.** This final strategy fully engages the honor/shame value. *Tell it to the church*, makes it fully public. It is a matter in which the community is the final arbiter, as it always is in matters of honor/shame. If the offender (sinner) disregards the community's judgment, then that one is to be treated like a Gentile and a tax collector, that is, treated as being outside the community (literally, ex-communicated). Remember when excommunication seemed to have such power in the American Catholic consciousness? How about the general consciousness? Is the Sinatra sense of "I'll do it my way" something of a core value to us today so that we have a diminished allegiance to a group – even sometimes our very family? This is certainly not true in the Mediterranean culture. Without community, one is effectively, even literally, dead. Without community, there is no network, no support, no possibility of surviving alone. To be considered an **outsider** – that is, treated like a Gentile or a tax collector – would be the very lowest one could be.

From v.18 through v.20, Matthew three times makes the point that the context is the community; unlike at 16:19, it is not Peter alone who has the responsibility of binding and loosing. When the community gathers in Jesus' name, Jesus is there; when the community agrees on a given matter, the Father in heaven will honor it. That's pretty powerful!

If today you hear God's voice, harden not your hearts.

In the Ezekiel pericope, the warning to listen to God's voice is given both to the prophet and to the reader. To the prophet: *Son of Man, I have appointed you as watchman for the House of Israel; when you hear a word from my mouth, warn them from me; the consequences are: if you do not speak out to warn the wicked person to renounce such ways, the wicked person will die for this guilt, but I shall hold **you**ⁱ responsible for the death.* To the reader: *If, however, you do warn someone wicked...and that person does not repent, then the culprit will die for this guilt, but you yourself will have saved your life."*

If today you hear God's voice, harden not your hearts.

Putting the Gospel together with the piece from Romans: *For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them...God's incarnate Word, here, among us! St. Paul says that our only response to this love is to*

*[o]we nothing to anyone, except to love one another;
for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law.*

*Love does no evil to the neighbor;
hence, love is the fulfillment of the law.*

So What? It is only in this love that it is possible to hear and give witness to this prophetic message. Only in this love is it possible for one to confront another sinner and make peace with honor satisfied.

Only in this love, on international levels as well as interpersonal levels, is it possible that the people of the book, Jew and Christian and Muslim, can hold this as a core value. Is this the sacrament of reconciliation?

The Michael Joseph Foundation Dinner and Auction will be held on **Saturday, October 11th**, at the beautiful 58-acre Sanfilippo Estate in Barrington Hills. Sacramental Celebrations

Baptism: Registration in the parish is a prerequisite. For those parents who are baptizing their first child, please allow 2 to 3 months in order to attend 2 required Baptism sessions *before* setting the Baptism date. For a subsequent child's baptism, an interview session must be scheduled prior to setting the date. All schedules are done in the parish office. Please call 847.382.5300.

Marriage: A son or daughter of a registered parishioner or a registered and active parishioner will need to schedule an interview with a parish staff person to set a date and start the marriage process. Please call 847.382.5300.

First Eucharist and First Reconciliation: These sacraments are celebrated in the second grade. Candidates must complete the preparation program which is coordinated through the REP program. Please call the REP office at 847.620.3068.

Confirmation: This sacrament is celebrated in high school. Candidates must be registered parishioners and complete a 2 year preparation program including large and small group involvement. Please call 847.620.3072.

Reconciliation: Saturdays 9:15 - 10:00 a.m. and by appointment.
