## FROM THE FRIENDLY CONFINES

Dear People of Saint Anne,

The words of Jesus in today's Gospel have a rather harsh tone: ***If anyone comes to me without turning his back on his father, mother, spouse, children, brothers, sisters, indeed one's very self—he cannot be my disciple.***

Father Don Senior, an incredible Scripture scholar who resides in Chicago, in offering a reflection on this passage, tells us that the Greek word for ***hate*** doesn't carry with it the same emotion that the English word ***hate*** conveys. It simply has to do with choice or preference; if it comes between this and that, I choose this rather than that. In Greek, this would be conveyed by saying that, in comparison, I love this and hate that. But, as we know, these words have a greater sting in English.

***One of my favorite saints is Saint Thomas More.*** In 1529, Thomas More was made the Lord Chancellor of England. He was a very popular choice; he was bright, articulate, witty and much loved by those who knew him, including King Henry VIII. But when Henry divorced his wife Catherine and married Anne, he wanted all of his subjects to support that decision; they had to sign an oath that they agreed with this – that his marriage to Catherine was null and void, that his future children would be legitimate successors to the crown, and finally, that Henry was ***the only supreme head of the Church of England.***

Thomas More could not accept this proposal so he quietly resigned his position as Lord Chancellor and refused to sign the oath. He didn't speak out against the king, but Henry had him arrested and placed in the Tower of London. Thomas' wife pleaded with him to sign; most everybody did – even the bishops of England. But Thomas said that he couldn't do it with integrity. Margaret, his favorite daughter, begged him to sign, but he didn't. Finally, a trial was held, false witnesses were brought forward, and Thomas was condemned and executed.

Thomas More didn't hate his wife or children, but his commitment to God was at the very deepest level and it cost him everything. I suggest that the life and witness of Thomas can begin to help us see what today's Gospel is about. The faithfulness of Thomas should cause us to ask ourselves: ***what is our level of belief and commitment to Jesus Christ?***

Our first response may be of course, Jesus comes first above anyone or anything. That is the correct answer, but is it real and true in the way we live our lives? If it is true, then Jesus is more than someone I admire or a friend in need. To be a disciple of the Lord means that I am willing to walk in his footsteps and follow a different way of life – the Reign of God. I attempt to live the teachings he taught with all my being; it affects every aspect of my life. A good question for us to honestly ask ourselves: Is Jesus Christ at that level of priority and importance in my life? ***Let's give that some serious thought this week.***

If you have any interest (and I hope you do) in these adult faith formation offerings: **Book Discussions–Date Night–Films of Faith–Men of Action and Contemplation–Mornings for Men–RCIA–Scripture Study or Women's Faith Time**, please sign up through the **GIFT registration form in the bulletin or on the website.** *These particular programs do not require the \$120.00 registration fee; we are simply attempting to gain a sense of interest and contact information so that we can notify you when these events unfold and take place in the coming year. Registering through GIFT enables us to make sure you are provided with information in due time before they take place.*

**As a Core Parish staff, we have met regarding the tragic issue of suicide** that has greatly impacted our Barrington community, but even more significantly, our parish community, over the last three years. We are well aware of the many courageous and enlightening attempts of Barrington High School and the larger Barrington community to resource, counsel and walk with families and young people during these very difficult and tragic times. **After our staff meeting this past week, both Father Fred and Ellen Nelson** agreed to organize, direct and discern how we, as a Catholic faith community, need to handle this hard and challenging issue, not only from a mental health perspective, but from a spiritual, faith-based starting point. If you have any ideas, observations or insights as to what you believe we need to offer our young people and parents in our parish community that can help us be more proactive in facing and dealing with the issue of suicide, please call or email them.

**Finally, it is just over a year since** I was named your pastor, and I continue to grow into that role and position. It has been quite a roller coaster adventure. I am so thankful for your patience, support affirmation, honesty and willingness to accept me as your own. My motto has become ***it takes three years***, if not longer, for us to grow in greater trust, acceptance and understanding of one another.

Please know that I am so glad to be among you; I hope the feeling is mutual. I trust that you will continue to honestly bring forth your thoughts, concerns and ideas as to how and where we need to grow as a parish community. We need to keep striving to be a church that is welcome to all and is a credible, authentic sign of the Reign of God present among us. We may not always agree – but know that the door to the Blue House is always open to your hopes, critique, observations and dreams for Saint Anne.

<p><b>Community Events</b></p> <p>At the center of GIFT are eight community events for people of all ages to learn and share their faith with our parish community. Six of these events include a meal, prayer, age and household-based breakouts, and faith sharing in a 2.5 hour session. Each event is repeated six times, Monday through Saturday, with participants selecting the session day they wish to attend. Monday is reserved for adults and high school students only with Tuesday through Saturday welcoming all ages. For grades 1 through 5, Tuesday and Wednesday formation will be coordinated with the First Eucharist Preparation and Grade 3-5 Catechesis programs (see descriptions below.) Thursday through Saturday breakouts will be based on that session's topic and will include First Eucharist instruction for grades 1 and 2. Families with children in these grades may choose to attend whichever community session best meets their schedule. ### Child and Teen Programs

<p><b>Confirmation Preparation</b> Preparation includes participating in GIFT community sessions, attending a five-part Confirmation preparation series, a retreat experience, and completing and reflecting upon a social justice project. - Children attend nine Grades 1-2 Sacrament Preparation or Grades 3-5 Catechesis sessions on either Tuesdays or Wednesdays between the Community Events.

You can choose to attend the Community Events as a family any day, Tuesday through Saturday; your child can attend Grades 1-5 Faith Formation on Tuesday or Wednesday. Your family may choose to attend only the Community Events, only the Grades 1-5 Faith Formation, or both.

To receive the greatest benefit for your family, attend both the Community Events and the Grades 1-5 sessions. ## OUR WORK HAS MEANING

Work is a popular subject for conversation in many and varied circles. "What do you do?" is often one of the first questions that follow an introduction to someone. Work! We are living out our lives in a time when work has fallen on both prosperous and desperate times.

It would be well to examine our own attitude toward work. In this season, when we celebrate a national day called Labor Day, it is a good time to consider what this day might mean in our lives. The summer draws to an end, children return to the schedule of school days, vacations are held in our memories and photos, and we are back to the regular routine of life.

Work! God has given each one of us a task to perform and a role to fulfill. It can be lofty or humble, but whatever it be, it is our vocation in life. Our work can be looked upon as an assignment, a drudgery, or a privilege. Someone once summed up this idea in a few lines: "No matter what my daily chores might be to earn my livelihood, still may I see that my job, the real position I hold, is bringing others to the Master's fold." History has shown us that great leaders, well-known men and women, have been motivated by similar thoughts and have accomplished great things in their lives because they believed in this goal.

### Luke 14:25-33

anyone of you who does not renounce all his possessions  
cannot be my disciple."

Over the past weeks, Luke has insisted that even those whom the culture deems lowly and unworthy are indeed to be invited to feast in God's kingdom (see last Sunday). In today's parable, he presents us with a collection of seemingly harsh demands which are peculiar to his gospel and which emphasize the kind of dedication to the Lord that allows no sidetracking. We have seen this before at 9:59ff when Jesus overturns the well-ingrained obligation that children must bury their dead parents (13<sup>th</sup> Sunday) and, on the 20<sup>th</sup> Sunday, Jesus says, *Do you think I have come to establish peace on earth? No, I tell you, but rather division* (12:51).

It's true, the people have come to Jesus, they follow him, but verses 26, 27 and 33 seem like a total rejection of all that the crowd would hold dearest. How does understanding the culture values of that time shed light on these peculiar sayings about giving up family, property and possessions, in order to take up a *cross* instead?

Note that this collection follows on the heels of last week's parable of a meal at which Jesus turns upside down the prevailing custom of seating arrangements with its accompanying scramble for positions. It is not to be that way with you, Jesus says, because you are instead to be deliberate about inviting the very outcasts of society. Recall that meals were the most important social function because during them, relationships were established/re-established and were solidified with networking with the consequence that the social fabric of survival was maintained. Remember that outside of the network, there was no chance of survival; none outside that given group would even tend to an outsider. (Compare the story of the "prodigal" son in Luke 15; or the cripple in John 5.)

Today, Luke is starkly blunt in insisting that to be a disciple, one must be *prepared* to even abandon the comfortable, life-sustaining network of the extended family in order to follow Jesus. Think of it: leave the only known way of survival in a society that operates solely on close-knit relationships in exchange for the unknown! Recall that Luke is writing about two generations after Jesus' death. If one remains only a literalist and considers only that Jesus said this or Jesus did that, then this trade-off of one set of relationships for another lesser unproven one, would be impossible. Consider that at this point, Luke's community has been established so they had already experi-

enced something of what it was like to detach from the extended family into which they are born and re-attach to a new group built around Jesus, a **non-relative**, as the center. Hard, no doubt! Perhaps not as stark as when Jesus first uttered it. One might speculate that Luke's community may have even tasted something of the freedom in living outside the constraints that occurred in natural families and instead, living in the potentially liberating atmosphere of a Jesus community. Luke does emphasize the downside, which was obvious already to his community: living apart from the extended family was risky. It meant being thrown on resources that were not yet present: a new, still untried network of people gathered around someone who was speaking in a new fashion, even using a language yet unknown, about a group yet untried. It meant becoming extremely vulnerable since there were no public agencies or charities, no grant funds, no such thing as "set-asides" on which to depend. It was risky; once they severed from their family group, they would be cut off from life. Moreover, following Jesus by remaining with this group would expose one to ridicule, isolation and even persecution. This was a cross which for some might become *the* cross.

It is in this sense that the word "hating" in v.26 becomes less stark. The Hebrew verb translated as "to hate" means "to leave aside," that is, to prefer nothing over remaining in solidarity with Jesus and the group – not possessions, not one's life, not one's family.

The two stories at vv. 28 and 31 serve to warn that one must be realistic and careful in assessing the cost of discipleship. Nothing rosy-eyed here! Luke cautions that the outcome could be the abandonment of all possessions if it came to choosing between Jesus and things or between Jesus and others.

These sayings are something of a prelude to the next week's scripture that speak to us the familiar parables about the great joy of the God who embraces those who return from being lost.

(1<sup>st</sup> Rdg) [W]ho ever knew your counsel, except you had given wisdom and sent your holy spirit from on high?

(Ps.) In every age, O LORD, you have been our refuge.

(Gosp.) Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple.

**So what?** Humankind has had centuries of experiences in the struggle to place family, possessions, country in proper perspective to God. What do we mean when we say to ourselves that we "take up our own cross?"

<sup>i</sup> This perspective is what is meant by the biblical term, *righteousness*. One is said to be righteous (or justified) when one continuously strives to hold in balance and equal relationship all that God has created.

3. Visit Catholic Relief Services website, [www.crs.org](http://www.crs.org). They are hard at work in Haiti, serving some 200,000 of the poorest and most marginalized Haitians. CRS projects provide assistance with health and nutrition, education, water and sanitation, HIV and AIDS, agriculture, peace-building and migration.
4. Walk or sponsor a walker in the upcoming *CROP* Walk on **Sunday, October 17th**. Church World Service works in Latin America and the Caribbean with programs that vary from supporting families as they work towards food security, standing up for the rights of vulnerable children and indigenous peoples across the region, and providing vocational education for youngsters in Haiti.




