

FROM THE FRIENDLY CONFINES

Dear People and Friends of Saint Anne,

Christ is risen today! Alleluia!

Welcome one and all to the Great Easter Feast! With every fiber of our being, we believe that because of the Resurrection of Jesus, the grace and promise of new life is always the gift and surprise that awaits us in and through the dark passages we know in life's journey.

As Christians, resurrection is the very core of our faith. Yet in an age when many suspect any universal religious message, when many people are living through personal and economic uncertainty, when the integrity of our church leaders is questioned, when the threat of violence and global devastation seems to surround us – **we know well that belief in the promise of resurrection is not for the faint-hearted.**

If resurrection is to be a living event for us, as it was for the first witnesses, it must **be grounded in practices of new life.** Such was the case for a group of frightened followers of Jesus, whose transformation and courage after the death of their Teacher and Lord turned them into a lively group of disciples who risked their lives and reputations to spread the message of the Risen Christ that changed the world they inhabited.

What does it mean to engage in practices of resurrection and new life? Like those first disciples, we need to be witnesses, in very recognizable ways that reveal to all we meet, the transformation that has created such a change in us in real and tangible ways in our own lives. We need to share those events, times and places in our life journey, where we have been awakened to New Life in Christ ... encounters of hope, possibility, healing, forgiveness, new beginnings and conversion. For these are living signs of Christ rising within his people.

On Easter, we are given a mission to name and embrace our moments of resurrection and to do something countercultural for us—to testify to our encounters with the spirit of the Risen Christ and to share how and where we have been given new life or have been touched by holiness. But, like the disciples in the upper room, we are often afraid to share our experiences, not wanting to be identified as **those Christians** who know it all.

A recent Pew Center reports that 50% of mainline Christians have experienced moments of spiritual transcendence. In other words, half of the people with whom you shared Easter Eucharist this day have known a similar spiritual experience – but have seldom shared their stories. Our belief in the Resurrection demands and calls us to claim and to pass on these moments of new life and holy presence to others. We are called to be witnesses for one another. We die alone – we only rise in communion with one another.

During this Easter season, let our Alleluias be not half-hearted. For Christ the Lord is risen today! This is the day the Lord has made. Let us rejoice and embrace this new life and praise God for the gift of resurrection, while opening our eyes to *live and practice resurrection* with body, mind and spirit renewed.

I hope and pray that you and your families will know the deep joy of Easter life this year. May your Easter celebrations and gatherings be filled with hope, affection and an awareness of God's life-giving presence between you.

Our "new Catholics" have gathered on a weekly basis for over a year. GIFT Growing in Faith Together

Do we ever graduate from growing in our faith?

In the past, the Church has educated us as children with Confirmation often feeling like our “graduation.” Is faith education something we really ever graduate from?

As parents, we may share concerns about our children’s faith education and experience. Are they learning enough? Is there more that can be done? In truth, the more that we as adults practice our faith as part of our everyday lives within our church, our homes, our workplaces, and the wider community, the stronger the faith of the next generation will be. Faith formation and education is all of our responsibility – not just the parish and not just the community – all of us together.

This approach allows each of us, as individuals and households, to participate in practicing and forming our faith together with the support of the entire parish community. We behave in this way in our wider community with parents and other adults in the role of coach, scout leader, and tutor; children and teens act as school buddies, peer advisors and camp counselors. We teach, support and encourage each other in so many ways outside of our faith lives, why not employ these same principles in our faith lives?

New ways of thinking and acting may occasionally be challenging for us. We are naturally comfortable with the way things have “always been.” What if Alexander Graham Bell had remained comfortable with the way things had always been or Louis Pasteur or Thomas Edison? If we continually seek the latest technology for our cell phones and the newest fashions for our wardrobes, then why should we continue to learn and grow our faith in the same old ways?

Whole Community Catechesis responds to people’s inborn hunger to be with God. Our faith is constantly moving, growing and changing and we must move with it to become adult Christians of mature faith, following the Way of Christ, sharing supper and Eucharist, working hard for justice and peace, and turning our hearts to Christ over and over again throughout our lives.

Over the next few weeks, you will begin to see information on upcoming faith formation opportunities within the parish. We invite you to review these opportunities and consider joining with our St. Anne community as a participant and as a volunteer.

Part of being a Christian is the unending process of announcing the Good News and assisting each other to live by it through sharing our lives of faith with one another.

St. Anne Builds Hope

St. Anne's Role in a Resurrection Story



Things are changing in Nkokwe, and the principal of the primary school, Edouard Ntamabyaliro, quickly points out that it is in large measure because of the support and generosity of the St. Anne Community and its Lenten almsgiving effort. He points to cisterns, school buildings, maps and charts, teacher manuals, bed nets, scholarships, and stipends that allowed teachers and literacy instructors to continue their work even as the village was displaced for a period of time. He talks about Jackie Griffin, a Lutheran seminary student who spent 18 months in Rugari Parish, working on

various St. Anne projects and doing much of our organizational work. Edouard loves to tell the story of his own daughter, Rosette, who lost both her legs in an accident on the way to school. Her journey to Barrington and a pair of prosthetics were made possible by St. Anne, and now Rosette is about to start at the university in Goma.


Edouard's tone changes when he speaks of new hope that is budding, like their spring plantings: of peace in the village, of girls—like Elisabeth, pictured above—completing primary school, of more adults than ever wanting to enroll in literacy classes, and of teen boys opting to stay around to help on the farms instead of joining the armies or militias. He, and so many of the villagers and parishioners, knows that education is key to nurturing this hope. Our work to start a secondary school—our 2011 effort—is a powerful motivator for students and parents alike in Nkokwe. The rates of primary completion dramatically improve when families know that it is possible for their children to go beyond the six grades of primary education. They make decisions differently when school is more than a dream. Young people dream of learning skills that will allow them to teach school, become nurses, build houses and roads, make their farms produce surplus food, learn computer skills in a country which is quickly becoming wireless, and become contributing members of a larger community.

More than anything, the Congolese people are resilient. In the five years St. Anne has worked with them, we have learned that people can endure incredible hardships and still find faith in God and in humanity. Faithjustice thanks the St. Anne Community for your continuing support in building, not just school buildings, but in bringing hope to our sisters and brothers across the ocean.

GIFT Growing in Faith Together

THE HOLY FAMILY

There is little known about the years that Jesus was growing up and living with Mary and Joseph. We get a little glimpse of that time, however, with the story of the boy Jesus in the temple as told by Luke. It is the only story that says anything about Jesus during his adolescent years, seen through the eyes of his parents. We see in this story normal family life in first-century Palestine, highlighted by a missing child who is not where he ought to be. As any parent might be, Mary and Joseph were desperate looking for Jesus among the crowds, and then were astonished when they found him in serious conversation with the rabbis of the temple.

We would agree that an incident such as this in the life of the Holy Family is one that would cause concern for any parents. What we fail sometimes to understand is that Mary and Joseph certainly experienced the same sorrows, challenges and joys of any family today. And yet, it is because of their total submission to God's will throughout their lives that they are recognized as "The Holy Family."

By looking at the Holy Family, can we see qualities that can make our families "holy?" The answer: none of our families can be *exactly* like the Holy Family. Yet, we can identify with Jesus, Mary and Joseph in many ways. We can look at some of the similarities and struggles of their lives and ours and find examples in the way they accepted and dealt with them.

- Joseph and Mary faced difficult choices. Joseph had to trust God and take pregnant Mary as his wife while Mary had to face great obstacles when she gave her "yes" to bearing God's son.
- They had to leave their homeland for safety in Egypt and moving was not an easy option.
- They wanted to provide a security for Jesus and yet, they experienced panic in losing a child for three days in Jerusalem.
- Mary can relate to a grief-stricken parent when she cradled the body of her crucified son in her arms.
- Joseph, as a carpenter, was a family provider who worked hard to fulfill his obligations.
- Jesus relates to teens as he wanted to "do his Father's will" but had to remain subject to Mary and Joseph until the appointed time.
- Mary and Joseph did not always understand Jesus, but they supported him in his decisions.
- The Holy Family was challenged to know and follow the will of God in every way that all humanity is challenged.

In conclusion, we can say that a holy family is one that does the will of God. Christ alive in us unites us, works through us, and makes us holy – that makes our family a family of faith – a holy family.

Brothers and sisters:

For our paschal lamb, Christ, has been sacrificed.
- ⁸ Therefore let us celebrate the feast,
not with the old yeast, the yeast of malice and wickedness,
but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth.

John 20:1-9

- ¹ On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning,
while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb.
- ² So she ran and went to Simon Peter
and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them,
"They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him."
- ³ So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb.
- ⁴ They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first;
⁵ he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in.
- ⁶ When Simon Peter arrived after him,
he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there,
⁷ and the cloth that had covered his head,
not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place.
- ⁸ Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first,
and he saw and believed.
- ⁹ For they did not yet understand the scripture that he had to rise from the dead.

Sharing the Living Story

*This is the day the Lord has made;
let us rejoice and be glad.*

Once again, the refrain to the Psalm of this day (2nd Scripture above) gives the clue to the integrity among all four scripture passages. The refrain calls us to rejoice on this day of days! Rejoice about what? Christ is not dead; he is alive. He is not in the tomb; he is raised! He is not what we thought he was; he is glorified, resurrected, not just resuscitated. In other words, the categories we used to think in are insufficient so we must think in **new ways**; *not with the old yeast . . . but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth* (3rd Scripture above)ⁱ

Yet, is it not we who must die to former ways, ways that were bound to the old system of thinking? Luke is strong in making this point as he tells the story of Peter preaching to the **gentiles** of Cornelius' household just before their conversion (1st Scripture). Jesus *is Lord of all*, not just of the Chosen.ⁱⁱ And we who are witnesses, who have reflected on what the Lord did in bringing **us** through the darkness of this Lent, are now chosen to be witnesses, to speak, to testify, about who The Christ was for us during our journey and who The Christ can be for others whom we have yet to encounter.

God is at work again. *This is the day the Lord has made . . .* John, the gospel writer, again uses his favorite device: Mary of Magdala comes to the tomb *while it was still dark*; John's darkness is always darkness of spirit – a state of unknowing. She thinks someone has stolen the body!ⁱⁱⁱ But note how the characters and their relationship in this story also point toward a fading of the old systems of thinking. Mary, under a wrong impression, runs to tell the leadership (Peter and the Beloved Disciple) that the Lord is missing. Peter and the Beloved Disciple run back; the latter arrives first but defers to Peter;^{iv} Peter goes in first but apparently remains in the "dark." It is the other one, the Beloved Disciple, arriving second, who sees and believes (v.8). Yet, neither fully gets it (v.9). It is the woman, Mary Magdalene, to whom John gives precedence (See the next story, at v.11). It is she to whom The Christ, the resurrected Jesus, first appears; it is she whom The Christ mandates to go to his brothers and tell of the coming ascension. Think of it, John's insistence in positioning Mary as an apostle^v is very remarkable in the face of his patriarchal society. But it is clear: **the old categories are to be erased, and new ways of thinking must now be used,**

. . . let us rejoice and be glad.

Four scriptures and many words of explanation, **So What?**

What is it that stirs in us this Easter of 2011? Can the scripture and preaching and Mass prayers of today and the next seven weeks of Easter^{vi} move us into new ways of thinking? Or will the old categories continue to dictate who we are and therefore how we will act toward family, friends, those with whom we work, those whom we do not even know?

To push the question even more . . . what does this new life in Christ of which we spoke when we renewed our Baptismal promises ask of us as we continue the attempt to stabilize Afghanistan and Pakistan as well as states in North Africa and the Gulf region?

Over the next weeks, stay close to the stories of the risen Jesus, The Christ, as the Lectionary^{vii} depicts his appearances to the newly chosen of God.

ⁱ Ancient bread makers recognized this metaphor. New bread is made from freshly prepared dough, not from previous batch or starter dough; it was therefore unleavened bread (see the Jewish Feast of Unleavened Bread) because it did not yet contain yeast cells from the ambient air.

ⁱⁱ The Chosen are the Israelites and their descendants; chosen by God to be God's very own.

ⁱⁱⁱ Grave robbing was a common problem then; heavy penalties were imposed when the desecrators were caught

^{iv} John writes around the start of the 2nd century; already Peter is thought of as leader of the Apostles.

^v This story (John 20:11-18) is heard only on Tuesday in the Octave of Easter (the Tuesday following Easter Sunday each year).

^{vi} This period of eight weeks from Easter Sunday through Pentecost is called the time of mystagogia, when the **Church**, and its newest members – those baptized, confirmed and eucharized at the Easter Vigil, along with those of other Christian traditions who were also confirmed and eucharized that night – ponder the lessons arising out of the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of the Lord.

^{vii} Lectionary: the Church's collection of portions of scripture selected to form a cohesive sense during a given liturgy and during seasons of the Church year.


