### INQUIRIES FROM THE AUDIENCE

Miss Denise Rafferty, Jewel Park, requested information concerning Jewel Park sewer infiltration. The Village Manager explained that Flint Creek has no sewage but storm sewers become easily saturated when the creek water level is high. He reported the Village has taken the following steps eliminating 130,000 gallons of infiltration each day:

- (1) Eliminated the Jewel Company sewer in Elm Road.
- (2) Cut off the Barrington Meadows sewer.
- (3) Connected the Oak Road sewer to Elm Road sewer.
- (4) Plans to remove obstructions in Flint Creek.

An emergency arose in the Fox Point sewer line concerning infiltration and offset problems in approximately forty feet of sewer line.


#### MOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

### MAY 31, 1972

- NOTE 1 Penalties for late payments of payroll tax depository amounts were assessed by the Internal Revenue Service. These penalties were abated subsequent to date of audit, according to management.
- NOTE 2 The New York Office of Citizens For a Better Environment commenced operations on March 15, 1972.
- NOTE 3 The amount shown represents the balance due of loans made to Citizens For a
