The minutes were read and approved.

Treasurers report, Savings-\$631.00, Checking-\$38.41

Arbor Day assessments and dues are due.

The village planters are sponsoring a bus trip March 23. It will leave Langendor Park at 9:45 and return at 3:00 a.m. The round trip will be \$3.50 and \$5.00 if you would like a box lunch. Call Maxine Cook for reservations 381-7879.

Request that each garden club send 2 copies of their year book for the use of the council. Also a list of programs that were enjoyed.

The three new garden clubs will be incorporated into the rotation of officers for the council. Treasurer will be the first officer rotation for the new clubs.

For our bi-centennial project, the clubs will provide a weekly flower arrangement for the desk for the historical society thru 1976, using the club rotation in the library flower schedule. Hostesses will be supplied from May to Sept. on Sunday from 2-4. A total of 32 hostesses will be needed, 2 hostesses from each club for 2 sundays. There is a short training program for the hostesses.

Jean Ost reported on the forestry camp at West Frankfort, and Treed for Tomorrow, at Eagle River, Wisc. The cost for sponsoring a boy or girl is \$50.00 per person.

Sam Oliver reported that Arbor Day, April 30, we will need 600 trees, 300 of which we will ask for from Garden Club of Ill. She is checking prices for similar trees which we will purchase. We need donations of \$15.00 for baggies, and \$22.65 for Peat Moss. Pick up date in DesPlaines, for trees, is April 22 and must be picked up within 3 days. two members are needed from each club for bagging and taking to the schools. A letter will be sent each president concerning all the pertinent information.

There will be a week of clean-up, rather than a day. May 22 is the date for Barrington in Bloom. Park District will plant the Red, white, and blue petunias in planters. Chamber of Commerce has approved the building of planters for the planting of red, white, and blue flowers.

A letter recommending that a forester be hired for the village will be written by Pam, Maxine S. and Penny. It will be presented at the village board meeting on Jan. 26.

Mary Galvin reported that they are replanting the Robert and Ruth Work Park. Mary was thanked for her dedication and hours involved in this project.

The Hillside project should be pursued to see how the budget money has been spent. Next meeting will be March 9.
