Need Such an Ordinance Here
 The neighboring village of Dundee has passed an ordinance prohibiting the spitting upon sidewalks, floors of public buildings, and also to prohibit the throwing upon sidewalks or public grounds any fruit or vegetables, or parts thereof, including peanut-shucks, rinds, etc., with a fine of not less than \$1.00 nor more than \$10.00 and the cost of prosecution or by imprisonment in the county jail for not less than one nor more than ten days.
