Shot Firers' Bill Causes Row and Makes General Strike a Possibility. A meeting of the Illinois coal opera-ators will be held at Springfield to discuss the passage of the shot firers' bill. It is possible that a general shutch down of the state's mines will follow. Chaltman Justi of the association said:

Chairman Justi of the association said;

"This bill will make a radical change in mining conditions in illinois. Under our agreement with the United Mineworkers of Illinois men are to shoot and load coal, while the bill will compet operators to employ special men to do firing. By insisting on the passage of the measure, the miners have violated their agreement with the operators. That is to say, they have made it impossible for the terms of the agreement to be carried out. Many of the operators are in favor of abrogating contracts. A general strike may result."
