The Home Merchant vs. The Mail Order House.

It is too little appreciated that the home merchant has always at hand in the local newspaper an effective weapon for dealing with the encroachments of the mail order houses. The success of the catalogue firms has not been entirely due to the attractive prices they offer through economy in sales. It is at least a debatable question whether a mail order sale doesn't cost quite as much as one of the old-fashioned middle-man variety. The secret of their success is rather their enterprise in using the advertising space of the local newspaper to make their products better known than those of the local dealer in the very town where the dealer has his residence has a distinct advantage. The Review regrets this evil state of affairs as well as the home merchant. The basis of an alliance for combating it is outlined in a recent editorial of the Tonah, Wis. Journal:
 "Last week a request was received from a large and well known mail order house of Chicago to quote our price for a large advertising space in the Journal. We declined the proposition for the reason that the business drawn from Tonah and vicinity is a detriment to our city and is of no advantage to the people who patronize them. We prefer to do advertising for our local merchants at even less rates than the mail order houses are willing to pay for theirs. Nobody knows better than the proprietors of these houses the real value of advertising in the local press, and their appropriations for the purpose are liberal. If the advertising did not pay they would not spend their money for it. The houses whose advertising we refuse will find some other way to reach the people in this territory. It therefore

believes our merchants to be alive and meet it. The space which we will not sell to their competitors is open to them and it will be their loss as well as ours if they do not use it."

Just Wait One Year

The legislature at Springfield placed a ban upon the immediate remarriage of divorced persons in Illinois by passing the bill prohibiting divorced persons from marrying within a year after the decree has been signed by the court, except in cases where infertility is involved. In these instances the guilty person shall not marry again for two years. Violation is punishable by a penitentiary sentence of from one to three years, and the marriage is declared null and void.

Miguel de Cervantes.

The commemoration of the tricentenary of the publication of "Don Quixote" brings to the fore the complex personality of that prince of Spanish letters, Miguel de Cervantes Saavedra. "It is by the spirit he was a writer," mentioned Venon. Terry for a crusade against the infidel was good, and Cervantes was of those who gave it a willing ear. For five years the young Spaniard served the cross against the crescent, at Navarino, Corfu, Tunis, in Sardinia, Sicily and Italy. Don Juan de Austria himself bestowing to him his grand cross. Sailing for home, Don Miguel was captured by Algerian pirates and for five years more was a Christian slave. He returned to Spain a crippled soldier and a ransomered serf. He became a king's officer and married one Donna Catalina, a woman of noble lineage, but he had no children in his native soil, and he was more than once in prison. It is said that he began to write "Don Quixote" in a cell.
 "I've never blunted lance," he said, "nor lanced the pen," and one falling blow he took on the forehead, when he was in the stocks, full of choler and lover's plaints. He tried the stage, with scenes from his life in Algeria. The short story, then a most popular field, he attempted also. Yet twenty years of such labors brought him neither fame nor fortune. He had, however, the consolation of a devoted wife and a better school of experience, and when "Don Quixote" appeared, in Cervantes' fifty-third year, it was the work of a wise old man. It was a popular success, but instead of friends it won him enemies and left him in the slough of poverty. Cervantes never did not perceive the importance of his chief discovery. Not recognizing that he had broken out of the beaten path, he returned to his old ways, seeking again the honors of a poet in his "Journey to Persia." He agreed with his intimates that his future reputation would rest upon "Persiles and Sigismunda," a book now forgotten by all but scholars.

Health and Beauty.

At a recent gathering of health promoters in Chicago some of the speakers endorsed and emphasized the very old rules of simplicity and activity for the acquisition and preservation of beauty. One doctor declared, "Your system needs much water, and you should drink a proper quantity every day." Water, he added, rounds out the form and softens the skin, and is the best of all clothing and exercise, and the arguments may be summed up in the few simple rules: Drink water freely, wear less clothing, do more washing, operate a carpet sweeper, go outdoors more, wear shorter skirts and, in general, get back to the simple life.
 The women of Chicago, as well as other great cities doubtless are in need of these instructions, but there are tens of thousands of Venuses in form and feature throughout the country who have come up just in that way without giving the matter a thought, and there are other thousands who have tried up and do not worry about it either.
