ASK A FRANCHISE. Northwestern Gas Light and Coke Company Seeks Rights Here. It is not unlikely that the board of trustees of the village of Barrington will consider a prominent public improvement at its next regular meeting which will be held June 5.
The Northwestern Gas Light and Coke Co., of Chicago, a corporation extending its mains to suburban villages in Cook and adjoining counties, has submitted to members of the board copy of an ordinance asking the right to construct, acquire, operate and maintain gas works, mains, pipes and necessary appurtenances, supplying and distributing gas for illuminating and heating purposes in this village.
The company is now building into territory adjoining DanPalatine and will supply that village this fall. It has secured a franchise to enter Palatine and expects to supply that village next summer, and have a pipe line to Barrington in the fall of 1906.
The franchise asked is to extend over a period of 40 years, and the company agrees to lay not less than two miles of mains within the village limits before November 1, 1906, and to give the village a bond of \$5,000 to indemnify for any damage to streets.
Messrs. Thackeray of Chicago and Scharringhausen of DesPlaines were here Tuesday in the interest of the company.

VICINITY NEWS. Abstracted From Our Exchanges and Told by 'Phone. The first active step to be taken by the government towards the acquiring of land for the naval school which will be situated at North Chicago, was taken last week when the transfer of 50 acres was made by the North Chicago Land association to the Committee chairman representing the government in the transaction. Swamp lands of Waukegan and of Lake County may be reclaimed by the government in the near future. There are hundreds of acres of marsh territory in Lake county and along the north shore awaiting reclamation. A line now belonging to E. E.
