How Mukden Was Won.

of the Russians, and there they lay sleepless for several days, the thermometer for 15 or 20 degrees below freezing at night.

Next to Nodzu was Kuroki. To him was assigned a task requiring the same versatility which has distinguished his corps from the time of its crossing of the Yalu to the present.

Turning to Nogi, we find him making no advance at all on the 4th and 5th, the 6th he swung a little farther north. By this time the expected had happened. The reserves sent to the east early in the battle were marched back.

Now, the 7th was a red letter day for Kuroki's army. For once, it had laid on the frozen ground, making no progress. On the morning of that day the commander of the left division sent in word that the enemy was moving a little.

But the battle was scarcely won yet. Nogi was not out of danger. As hard and harder fighting was to come as had passed. The first army did not catch up with the Russian rear guard until they were ten miles beyond the Shakhe on the 8th.

The release of all the reserves on the Russian left meant more troops to press the Japanese left. On the 9th Oku found himself in the face of entrenched positions which he could not budge.

The parts of the Japanese right and Japanese left were now interchanged. Nogi had to resist the enemy's hammering while Kuroki swung to the northwest. The time had come when the right must break through and threaten the railroad on its own account.
