

There has been some discussion as to when Autumn really did arrive this year. The following official announcement is made by Lieut. W. J. Wilson, in charge of the United States hydrographic office in the Federal building, Chicago: "Autumn arrived on Saturday, September 23, at 23 minutes and 30 seconds after 11 a. m. This was the exact second when the sun crossed the equator on its journey from the north to the south this year, and marks the beginning of the fall season. Lord Byron on Poetry.

From fragments in Byron's recently published confessions it seems that this gifted singer did not take himself seriously as a literary genius. He wrote: "I can never get people to understand that poetry is the expression of excited passion and that a life of passion any more than a continuous earthquake or an eternal fever. I try to mean rank poetry or poets high in the scale of intellect. This may look like affectation, but it is my real opinion. It is the lack of the imagination whose eruption prevents an earthquake."

Byron posed as a man of the world and had little patience with the popular misconception of himself as "a misanthropic gentleman in wolfskin breeches given to fierce monosyllables" in daily speech.

In each case it appears to be a mere matter of euphony, as is quickly shown by putting the name of the victor first in the combination.
