A Weak Point is Ou Navy. Admiral Lac thinks the present time, Admiral Lae than, the present time, when there is no ingiting in propect for years to come, a fitting one to openly discuss a vital point is our naval harness which is so weak that, to use the admiral's own huguage, "the navy would find itself unable to win battles." It is better to learn that truth now than to have it disclosed by disaster in the event of war. The weak news consists of a worful lack of engineeries sciebte earry the raine de le-fring line on our modern complicated ships. Navyl engineering is in the highest degree a technical scleace and one not toke mastered by every officer who may have general capacity for the

service.

A bill to equip every navni officer with engineering experience has been on the books for three years, but for a variety of reasons little has been done to carry out its provisions. Chief among the drawbacks to the system adopted by the bill referred to is the dislike of the average naval officer for disfile of the average navai officer for the duties of the engine room. Fur-thermore, many an officer who is capa-ble in every other branch has no apti-tude for mechanical science.

Our navy is necessarily a great bur-den financially, and if it is to be maintained should always be ready for war. In 1808 we were plunged into a con-flict on short notice. Russia was taken by surprise in 1904, and the want of naval mechanics and engineers is be-lieved to have caused the delay in the sailing of the Battle fleet. Admiral Rae is at the head of the engineering department of the navy and speaks in department of the navy and speaks in plain language, with full knowledge of his subject. He says that young offi-cers who would not be trusted alone in charge of the deck of a warship have been placed alone at the head of the engine room. In one notable instance of recent date this state of things led of recent date this state of things led to a disaster more costly in unoney and lives than many a strring naval batche. The scarcity of officers caused by the large number of ships in commission has in a measure prevented the training of the younger men in engineering duties. It is proposed by Admiral Rae that this training be no longer neglected for gny cause and that instruction in the engine room be given under the superrision of specialists detailed for the duty. Even this plan would require years to bring out a supply of officers competent to handle a ship under all circumstances. And ha fast at the warships multiply in number more competent engineer of In number more competent engineer of ficers will be needed.
