**THIS HE FLATLY DENIES**

**Defense Completes Preparation for His Impachment—His Association with Detective Sterling.**

Boise, Idaho.—The first direct testimony in the defense of William D. Hayward was offered Tuesday and it was chiefly directed toward showing that Harry Orchard, blaming Frank Steuenerberg for the loss of his interest in the Hercules mine, had threatened to have revenge on killing him and that the conduct of Orchard and K. C. Sterling, both before the independence explosion, when they were frequently seen together, and afterwards, when Sterling called on the bloodthirsty was following Orchard's trail, justified the inference that the mine owners inspired the crime.
