BALLOONS ALL COME DOWN

NEW RECORD CLAIMED FOR THE FIELDING-SAN ANTONIO.
 Several in Dire Peril—French Aero-naut and Boy Dragged in Lake Michigan.

Chicago.—All long-distance aerial speed records were broken and a new world's long distance flight mark is claimed for the Fielding-San Antonio, owned by Dr. Frederick J. Fielding of San Antonio, Tex., which, piloted by Capt. H. E. Honeywell, descended to the earth Sunday at five p. m. at West Sheffield, Que.
 All of the nine balloons in the great international race which started in Chicago descended safely, but many thrilling escapes were reported. The United States and Canadian governments will be asked to measure the flight of the winning balloon.
 The unofficial figures on the flight of the balloons were as follows:
 Fielding-San Antonio—West Sheffield, Quebec, 895 miles.
 Hilsen-De la Quinte, Lake Ontario, 545 miles.
 Chicago—West Monken, Ontario, 522 miles.
 American—Carsonville, Mich., 402 miles.
 United States—Pinkerton, Ontario, 318 miles.
 Cincinnati—Covert, Mich., 250 miles.
 King Edward—Port Huron, Mich., 200 miles.
 Columbia—Clinton, Ontario, 276 miles.
 Ville de Dieppe—Beaton Harbor, 65 miles.

While there is some doubt as to the exact length of the Fielding-San Antonio flight, the was able to keep the air a little less than seven hours longer than her nearest rival, the Hilsen, and was easily the winner of the contest. The two balloons had followed an almost parallel course during their long flight, and both were drifted from Picton, Ont., at the same time.

TRAGEDY IN NEPONSET, ILL.

The tragedy took place in the front yard of S. D. Carpenter, in whose family Miss Weinartz worked as a domestic. She was brought to the Kewanee hospital. No reason is known for the deed, though it is believed that the young man wanted the girl to marry him and she refused. Both were from Kewanee.

Two Killed in Auto Race.
 Dieppe.—The Grand Prix, the blue ribbon of the automobile world, was won Tuesday by a German, Louis Schlager, driving a Mercedes car. His time was 6 hours, 55 minutes, 43 seconds. Henry, in a Benz, was second. There were numerous accidents and two men were killed outright, the victims, while finishing the final round the tire of their machine, a Peabody, was torn off. The car was thrown on top of the two men and they were horribly crushed.

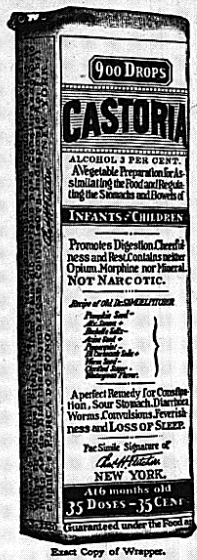
Shamrock Wins Lipton Cup.

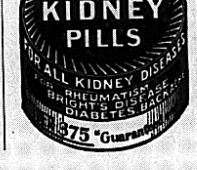
