"How to Restore Income" Subject Farm-Home Week

Many Lake County Farmers Plan to Attend Meetings

Steps to get back their share of the 1932 million dollar shrinkage in the annual Illinois farm income will draw the major interest of Lake county farmers and homesteaders when they attend their annual Farm and Home week, January 10 to 26, at the College of Agriculture, University of Illinois, according to farm adviser, H. C. Giberson.

Help in rebuilding farm income to a more normal amount figure and restoring the buying power of agriculture is promised in 29 different courses arranged by different departments of the college. These courses will stress more effective marketing, cheaper and more production, higher quality products, reduction of losses and wastes on the farm and in the farm home and higher living standards, as well as a greater variety of community interests and a happier rural life.

Judge Ralph Daly Will Be Candidate for Re-election, He Tells Newspaper Men

Circuit Judge Ralph J. Daly today announced that he will be a candidate for re-election in the spring, by admitting that he would resign to the bench unless something came.

The nominating convention is to be held in March by the present committee in Lake county, and the election will be in June.

It is very likely that the Democrats will place a candidate in the field, but the success of a democratic candidate is one of considerable doubt due to the fact that McElroy and Brown counties, which are in the 10th district, are overwhelmingly republican and Winnebago and Lake counties, which are in the 11th district, are overwhelmingly democratic but county officers, Judge Daly, receives \$2000 annually.

There is a threat that the state might reduce the salaries of circuit judges.

"If the salary should be cut to \$5,000 as an example, I might hesitate," Judge Daly said.

Circuit Judge Edward Shortell, of Macomb, and Circuit Judge Arthur Fisher of Rockford, also are expected to be candidates.
