Simplified Ballot Without "Tickets" for Local Election

For the first time in forty a election in Barrington will vote the annual village election, April without using party arranged ball paper candidate for office has been designated, and as a result the ballot will be printed without the name of candidates being listed under any ticket or party heading, according to A. C. Burant, village clerk.

Mr. Burant has planned simplified ballots in which the names of candidates will be listed in a single column and grouped only according to the offices for which the candidates are running.

Although the candidates are listed under tickets, there are or three groups of candidates including party candidates. The Government League has supported the candidates of John Carroll, T. Mason, William Thompson and George Robinson as a non-partisan group. H. D. A. Grobe for president of the board and T. E. Davis, Mrs. M. J. Sherman and Mrs. J. J. Grobe for trustees.
