Test Soils Before Adding Any Lime, Gardeners Advise

When soils are acid, "sour" as old timers used to say, nothing will do quite so much good as a dressing of lime, provided the area is to be used for plants that do best in a neutral or alkaline soil. The preference of the various plants should be the determining factor.

Most vegetables and flowers do best in a neutral or slightly alkaline soil, while grass grows very nicely in slightly acid soil. Because grass does so well in slightly acid soil, it is seldom necessary to apply lime to soils which are to be used for lawns. There are certain sections of the United States, however, where soils are extremely acid. In these sections lime is one of the prerequisites of successful lawn making.

While lime does contain calcium, a plant food element, lime's function in extending is that of a soil corrector—not that of a plant food. It should not be used until a test to determine the acidity of the soil has been made. Such a test is easily made with one of the simple and inexpensive soil testing kits on the market. Many gardening supply dealers test soils without charge as a part of their regular service to customers.

Often when the soil is so impoverished that grass cannot grow properly, it is lime moss will come in. If you are troubled with moss on your lawn, try feeding your lawn with a balanced plant food at the rate of four pounds per hundred square feet. Put the plant food on evenly when the grass is dry and after knocking the plant food to the ground with the back of a rake or a lawn broom, soak the area thoroughly. Exercise caution you not to over-water your lawn. Water it once or twice weekly, soaking it each time to a depth of 4 or 5 inches. Daily light sprinklings do more harm than good.
