Extracting Scents From Flowers The advantage method of extracting scents from flowers for perfumery is a process of extraction by exposing absorbent materials to the fumes of the flowers. It is used when whose volatile oils are delicate to be separated by distillation. In the Bernside perfume factory the flowers are kept in most air-tight contact with a preparation of muslin lined with a porous, which being odorous is exposed to the fumes. As the saturation point is reached the muslin is dissolved in water which in its turn absorbs the odor. The gross substance in the alcohol is removed by filtration. Fragrances (ingredients) are given to give perfume its last quality and also its "life" or "scent" are added, and the perfume is ready for bottling.
