"ABSORBING" THE TAX

Some merchants in border cities of the state are advertising that they are absorbing the sales tax. They are par-tially justified in so advertising because they are desperately trying to grevent loss of business to merchants in cities across the state line through an unfair trade condition imposed by their own state government. Some merchants in cities which are not located near a state line are claiming absorption of the sales tax. These merchants are not justified

Fundamentally it is wrong for anyone to advertise that which he does not have or can not do. No merchant is absorbing the sales tax. No merchant can absorb the sales tax and operate his business at a profit. A two per cent net profit on gross sales would be Eutopia to a retailer in almost any line. Mercants who claim to absorb the tax really do no such thing but in reality add the amount to the selling price without showing it on a sales slip or otherwise. That is not a difficult thing to do at a time when prices are changing

a difficult thing to do at a time when prices are changing rapidly, but if seems like a foolish thing to do.

When all is said and done the ultimate consumer and not the merchant is the man who pay the sales tax. The consumer should not be deceived by advertisements of absorption. He should be told that he pays the tax, reminded that he pays the tax and should not be permitted to forget it.
