New Village Is Born Near Crystal Lake, 12 Miles From Barrington

A brand new village has been born within 12 miles of Barrington. The 120 residents of Lakeshore on the south shore of Crystal Lake, McHenry county, completed preparations for organization of a village during the month of June and then held a special election to put their plans into effect. The new village is partly in McHenry and partly in DeKalb counties.

There were 60 votes cast—all of the possible electors of the community—and 48 of them voted for incorporation. One person voted against the plan. The residents are almost entirely people who have moved out into the lake front. A special election will be held to organize a village board of six trustees and a president.

First Blooms in Grass Lake Lotus Beds Reported

Expect Flowers to Reach Height of Season by July 22

The first of the lotus flowers for this season of the lotus in Grass Lake have made their appearance and are in full bloom. Many more will be in bloom, Jack O'Connor, veteran resort keeper on Barrington Island has reported. Probably the last week in July and first week in August will find the largest number of lotus flowers in bloom. If the lotus at Grass Lake is a bed of lotus, it is one of only three in the world. The other two known beds are in China and Egypt. Every year a discussion is carried on through the newspapers as to whether the blooms at Grass Lake are genuine lotus or not. Nearly every year some expert declares they are genuine, while some one finds a difference in coloring or texture from the Chinese and Egyptian flowers.

These beautiful blooms have made the Fox river lake famous and have attracted thousands of people from all over the district. One field of flowers near Barrington Island has an area of between 400 and 500 acres in the entire lotus blooming section. Most of the section is in Grass Lake although there are patches of them in Silverlock lake and in the channel between the two lakes. There probably will be many flowers in bloom next Sunday but the number will be much more beautiful by the following weekend.
