Ever since the commodity price level began its series of dizzy sinking spirals a few years ago, the public has been urged to "Buy Now."

Every "buy now" campaign failed for the simple reason that the general public is made up of a lot of individual persons who are primarily selfish for their own economic protection.

This fall, however, a "buy now" campaign is under way and is getting better. The reason is simple—"buy now" is a warning that the end is not a plea.

The low price level was struck early last spring. Prices climbed materially in May, June and July. Then in September, after a level month, prices again started upward.

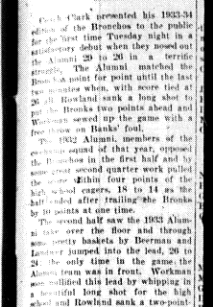
