Barrington High Basketball Lead Is Big Surprise

With the Northwest conference race on a third finished the Barrington Bronchos are occupying a rather precarious position at the top of the conference ladder. Although at a meeting of conference coaches late this afternoon the various schools predicted that the Bronchos would finish sixth in this year's race the Bronchos have done so far, winning the title three times so far, winning from Libertyville, Arlington (in a non-conference game Dec. 1), and Leyden, all rated about 200 points below the Bronchos in a high position in the final league standing.

The Bronchos have yet to meet Bensenville in the key game of the season, but through four conference foes in a row, totaling 103 points to their opponents' 98 but know for an undefeated season since 1931 when the remainder of the Bronchos schedule is reviewed. The Bronchos have yet to meet Bensenville and Warren in the first round after which they must play all of their foes over again.

Bensenville has a big rough team as one of the Leyden players remarked to a Bronchos player, "better wear your football suits when you play Bensenville."
