Former Resident Hurt While Trap Shooting With Friends at Home

Bryant Dain, former resident of this community, had a narrow escape from death or critical injury Friday afternoon, when he was accidentally shot in the left leg while trap-shooting at his home in Cannon Hollow, near Lake Oswego.

Dain was exchanging guns during a fall in the clay-bird shooting when the trigger of one was tipped, resulting in a discharge. The full charge of buckshot caught Dain in the left leg, below the knee, carrying away much flesh. He was taken to the Peckskill hospital and a physician called. Anti-toxin serum was administered to prevent the development of lockjaw. Barring infection, his recovery is expected.
