Sparta, of Century Ago In Out of the Picture About a century ago the site of ancient Sparta, capital of Laconia, was a scene of busy activity.

The history of the city may be summarized in a roster of dates: 1400 B. C., town founded; 1204, abdication of Helen of Troy by Paris; 1194, beginning of the Trojan war; 1170, return to Messenia and Helos; 1104, kingdom seized by Heraclides; 884-830, rule of Leonidas; 743-724, war with the Messenians; 627, revolt of the Messenians; 547, war with the Argives; 500, war with Athens; 491, war with Persia; 490, Leonidas, with 300 Spartans, at the battle of Thermopylae; 408, earthquake destroys 30,000 persons; 454, war with Athens; 401, Spartan victory at the battle of Plataea; 378, Spartan loss of dominion of the seas; 300, Spartans defeated by the Thebans at the battle of Mantinea; 314, Sparta overthrown by Philip of Macedonia; 147, Sparta, protected by Rome, again a leading state; 306, A. D., taken by the Romans; 1463, burned by Sultan Mahomet II.

Sealed proposals will be received by the Village of Barrington, Illinois in the Village Hall until 8 p. m. Central Standard Time on the 10th (10th) day of January, 1936, for the construction of sewers and sewage treatment plant, at which time and place they will be publicly opened and read.

Instructions to bidders, form of proposal, plans, specifications and form of a contract may be examined at the office of Consoer, Townsend & Quinlan, 295 W. Wacker Drive, Chicago, Ill. or at the office of the Village Clerk, Barrington, Illinois, and copies may be obtained upon the deposit of Fifteen (\$15.00) Dollars for plans and specifications for both the sewers and the plant, or Ten (\$10.00) Dollars for either the sewers or the plant. Seven Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$7.50) or Five Dollars (\$5.00) respectively of the amount of the deposit will be refunded to each bidder who returns the plans and documents in good condition within thirty (30) days after the opening of bids.

The Village of Barrington hereby reserves the right to reject any or all bids, or to accept the one that in its judgment will be for the best interests of the Village, all subject to the approval of the State Director, Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works.

Proposals are acceptable on any of the following conditions: (a) One contract for the entire work including sewers and treatment plant. (b) One contract for sewers and (c) Seven contracts for the treatment plant.

The contracts under (b) above shall be for: (1) Clearing, site grading, reinforced concrete foundation and excavation for same, steel and iron work and other items later specified. (2) All building superstructure. (3) All plumbing and underground sewer and water piping. (4) All heating for the main building. (5) All pumps and drives; air compressors and drives. (6) All mechanical equipment and drives. (7) All electrical work.

A certified check made payable to the order of: A. L. Wiedenbeck, the Treasurer of the Village of Barrington, Illinois in the amount of Five Per Centum (5%) of the bid must be deposited by each bidder with his bid as a guarantee that in case the award is made to him he will, within ten (10) days thereafter, on receipt of written notice of award, execute such contract and furnish a satisfactory performance bond.

On failure to do so, he shall forfeit the deposit as liquidated damages and acceptance of the bid will be contingent upon the fulfillment of this requirement by the bidder. The checks of all accepting the lowest formal bidder on each portion of the work will be returned within three (3) days after the opening of bids, while the remaining checks will be returned when the State Director has approved the executed contract.

Bidders cannot withdraw bids after filing same with the Village. The successful bidder will be required to furnish a performance bond satisfactory to the Village and approved by the State Director, in the amount of the contract. This contract is to be financed by a loan and grant by the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works and must be carried out in accordance with the "Rules and Regulations Relating to Applicants and Projects under the Emergency Relief Appropriation Act of 1935," P.W.A. Form No. 166 dated July 22, 1935 and as later revised.

All employees directly employed on this work shall be paid wages in no case less than the prevailing scale of wages. This scale of wages is in accordance with the P.W.A. Construction Regulations.
