## Bronchos Prepare for Revenge Fight by Leyden Quintet

### Expect Team to Remember Last Minute Rally of December 18

When the Leyden township high school Eagles meet the local cagers at Barrington Friday night in the sixth round of the North-west conference basketball schedule, the Bronchos will be faced with a gruelling ordeal, especially if their opponents are out for the revenge that is expected. Barrington has had eight consecutive victories, but the local team came closer to defeat at the hands of Leyden December 18 than at any other time during the season. If Leyden comes back for revenge with sufficient force and confidence the Bronchos may find a defender that they are led to first place instead of holding it close.  
In Barrington's first encounter with Leyden, victory was the result of dropping ten points through the hoop in the last few minutes of play and winning 23 to 21. Leyden led Barrington 17 to 9 at the end of the third quarter. Leyden had outplayed Barrington the entire game with the exception of the last few minutes. Leyden's opposing team kept scoring at the ball during most of the game. It was especially good on long shots but was not lacking in scoring on rebound. In Friday night's contest, Leyden will have the help of Kaden, tall guard who was sick at the time of the first game, and also of Chapp, lazy reserve forward, in addition to the first semester.  
Leyden's last hope of title recognition is centered in the team's ability to defeat Barrington Friday night. If Leyden can win all of its games and if Palestine loses one and Barrington two games including the one with Leyden, the latter team can still share in a three way tie for first place with Barrington and Palestine.  
A victory for Leyden Friday night will give Palestine its opportunity in the Pirates' final game with Barrington for an undisputed championship. Barrington's game with Leyden will be the most spectacular encounter remaining in the season until the final week when Barrington goes to Palestine March 1.  
It has been reported that two of the best officials obtainable have been engaged for the game. E. G. McLean of Elgin and Robert Ballard of St. Charles. The eagle eyes of these two men may account for a few ball hawks leaving the game before they are asked to.  
The lightweight game will begin 10 minutes earlier than usual at 7:15 p. m. in order that the radio message of President Roosevelt to the boy scouts of the nation may be heard at 7:45 p. m. between the halves of the game. The 15 minute broadcast will be heard at the basketball game. A large crowd is expected as Leyden games have drawn some of the largest crowds of the season.
