His low number, 439, indicates the possibility of his having been in the penitentiary for many years. "Crime don't pay" was written on the corner of the paper.

Continued from page 1 continuing the clearing house will be up to the merchants. Many feel that to continue the clearing house on a 5 per cent basis would mean a nuisance without sufficient benefit. It has been suggested that the clearing house be expanded, but it accepted an additional 10 per cent assignment from the depositors, and operate on a 15 per cent basis. In view of the fact that 15 or 20 per cent of the deposits are 60 or 90 days as predicted by the deputy receiver, an extension of the clearing house should be a safe venture of the merchants and surely would be welcomed by the depositors who have had funds tied up in the bank for more than two years. During the short life of the original clearing house a total of \$321,766 of deposits was assigned of this amount, \$252,944 was re-assigned to stores, professional men, etc. in payment for merchandise and services. Those depositors who have not spent all of their assignments will receive checks for half of the balance they still carry in the clearing house.
