

Title-Bound Bronchos to Meet Warren in Final Home Game Friday

Local Team Can Cinch Share in Title With Win

Bronks Shooting for 11th Straight Victory in Blue Devil Mix

B. H. S.'s Broncho cagers, sporting the only undefeated record in the Northwest conference circuit, will make their final home appearance when they meet the Warren Blue Devils at the school gym Friday night. A win will give the Bronchos edge over the Palatine Pirates, their closest rivals for the heavyweight title, they meet in the season's finale March 1. The Pirates have won nine and lost one straight. If Palatine beats Antioch Friday, and the Bronchos lose to Warren the two teams will be tied for first with 11 victories and one defeat. This would make the Palatine-Barrington encounter March 1 a championship game. However, if both the Pirates and Bronchos either win or lose their games Friday, the local team can do no worse than tie for the title in the event that Palatine wins the Bronchos record clear of defeat as Coach P. E. Clark substituted freely, sending a total of 11 players into the game.

Nine seniors will be making their last appearances on the home floor. They are Claude Conn, Carl Kitzers, Art Workman, Herb Mollackamp, Russ Overhiser, Jay O'Connell, Bob Wallace, LaVerne Knickman and Fritz Wendt. Whitford Wickham, the other senior Bronk is not expected to be back from Texas in time for the game. Eugene Latta, a junior, and Murray Grabenkort, a sophomore, complete the squad.

Bronchos Should Win On paper the Broncho quintet should easily defeat Warren Friday night at 7:30 p. m. Viewing the game with some degree of uncertainty. It is especially worried about the Bronkos' inability to keep from fouling out. In the last Loyden game three regulars went out on fouls and in the Wauconda game Friday, three men each had three personal fouls. In a close game the loss of a good player is sometimes the turning point of the game.

Coach R. P. Kotton of Warren has the outstanding player in the conference in Zimmerman, one dribbling forward, Dixon, a forward, and Phillips, a sophomore center, are the other Blue Devils players. Warren has improved a lot since Harrington defeated them earlier in the season. After losing all their previous conference games they advanced to the semifinals of the Chicago conference tournament, then losing to Libertyville only in an overtime game.
