Bronchos and Palatine Pirates to Tangle in Championship Battle

Meet on Pirate Court Friday in Final Game

Undisputed Title Is Broncho Goal; Capacity Crowd Expected at Game

The wind-up of Northwest conference basketball competition for the season Friday night will bring out the outstanding game of the entire schedule—the Barrington Bronchos-Palatine Pirate tussle on the Palatine court to decide the championship in the conference basketball division.

With the Bronchos out to gain undisputed claim to the title and the Pirates fighting for a share in the championship, real battle is expected. The local high school quarter clinched a share in the title by winning its 11th straight victory on a 12 game schedule at the expense of Warren last week. The Pirates have lost one game while winning 10 and must beat the Bronchos to become co-champions.

Due to the outstanding capacity of the Palatine gym is expected there will be a sell-out long before the preliminary game starts at 7:30 Friday night.

Although they led a 26 to 19 balloting by the Bronchos in the first meeting at Barrington, the strong Pirate five, with a home floor advantage, will take the court even choice to upset the local team. Headed by Captain James and Eddie Hahndorf, the Pirates have improved greatly in the second half of the conference race, trouncing Antioch 54 to 17 in their last shot.

Coach P. E. Clark's Bronchos are completely out of things in their HHS. heavy weight team has lost one game by winning Friday night. They can become the first local heavy weight team to ever win an undisputed conference championship and go through a conference schedule undefeated. With Jack out of school, the HHS will probably line up with Grabenkotter and Ritters at forwards. Can play the center position in the HHS. Mollenkamp is the reigning center but dropping back to guard with Workman at the other guard.

Bronchos Clinch Share in Title; Trounce Warren

D. feat Blue Devils 35 to 25 for 11th Conference Win; Latta Out

Barrington's Bronchos capped second themselves of at least a tie for the Northwest conference heavyweight championship by trouncing the Warren Blue Devils, 35 to 25, in the final home game last Friday night. It was the eleventh straight league win for the local high school players, enabling them to keep one game up on Palatine when they meet in their last conference encounter Friday.

Playing without Eugene Letta, regular center who has dropped out of school, the Bronchos, after running up a 32 to 8 margin at the three-quarters, coasted to an easy win with the reserves finishing out the game. Kerrie Grabenkotter, who filled in at Latta's place, led the scoring with 10 points. Claude Conn featured for the Bronchos adding all seven from three awards him and also played a brilliant floor game. Ken Zimmerman, rated as one of the best athletes ever to appear in conference basketball circles, showed why he is rated so, by leading Warren with 16 points. Warren's defense was weakened by the fact that Ames, a regular guard, hurt himself just before leaving for Barrington and was unable to play.

Coach T. C. Hosford's Pontes came through with their eighth conference victory, vanquishing the Warren lights, 30 to 22. Big Glen Hager featured for the Pontes with five field goals.
