In the report submitted to the board of trustees and for the purpose of financing, we do not charge the four or five dollars, in the opinion of the board, for the cost of this improvement by the sewer revenue financing, because the same cost would have to be borne by the same person as I propose that the village should do under sewer revenue financing. Therefore, we are not making our calculations on the basis of approximately \$125 dollars, service charge with an additional cost per lot of approximately \$39 dollars.
