Liberty Loan Bonds Are Called in for Exchange for Lower Rate Bonds
Local interest has been registered in the plan of the United States treasury department to call in all fourth 4 1/2 per cent United States liberty loan bonds, as of June 15, to exchange them for 2 7/8 per cent government bonds, according to accounts in the daily press this week. The bonds are exchangeable up to and including March 27.
Payment of interest on the present bonds will cease after April 15 in case of failure to exchange them. Exchange of bonds can now be made at par, whereas new bonds will be purchased above par value after March 27.

Rental Charge of \$15 Per Year for Sewer Is Planned
In Tentative Basis for Retirement of \$200,000 PWA Loan
From \$15 to \$45 per year rental for outlet connections to the sewer system would constitute the source of income for retiring the requested \$200,000 PWA loan with interest, according to a plan submitted to the board Monday night by Attorney David B. Maloney.
Mr. Maloney returned from Washington last week where he conferred with public works administration officials regarding the 20 year loan to Barrington. While there he conferred with the officials, he believes, that a bond issue to guarantee payment of part of the plan, unnecessary. The plan worked out by Mr. Maloney and administration officials based on the number of homes, store and other outlets and yearly amount of the loan to be retired, would place a graduated scale of annual rental as follows:
Single family homes, \$15.
Two family homes or apartment buildings, \$25.
Three family homes or apartment buildings, \$45.
Four family homes or apartment buildings, \$45.
Fifty-four commercial users would be charged according to the estimated use of the system. As a tentative basis for the large users, they would be charged in proportion to their water consumption at the rate of 8 cents per thousand gallons above the first ten thousand.
Trustee Carroll made a motion that a committee of three be appointed to equalize the commercial users' charge.
