Local Women Plan Artistic Entries for Flower Show

Two Barrington organizations, the Garden Club of Barrington and Countywide Garden club will have entries at the annual flower and garden show sponsored by the Garden Clubs of Illinois which is to open at Navy Pier Saturday, April 6. All exhibits must be in by Friday noon, according to a notice received by Mrs. Samuel Howe.

The major exhibit of the local Garden club will be an exquisite dinner table with a shadow box background—water lilies predominating. Mrs. E. Christian Kohl-sarr, chairman of the committee arranging that exhibit, will be assisted by Mrs. Elizabeth Howland, Mrs. Harry Clark, Mrs. Frank Whiting, Mrs. Potter Smith, and Mrs. Gordon Cameron.

Two minor exhibits will also be displayed by this club. Mrs. Samuel Rowe and Mrs. Richard Keyser will arrange a terrace table and Mrs. Alfred Baerle will enter a terrarium.

Having won a blue ribbon for their entry last year, members of the Countywide Garden club are enthusiastic about their chances this year. Mrs. Norman Nestoroff and Mrs. Harold Holmes will arrange a hand branch exhibit as the group's contribution to the show.

Innovations in the Chicago show for 1935 will include a “Garden of Camellias, rhododendrons and azaleas will bloom beneath great trees draped with Spanish moss. “Sectional gates” representing every part of this country are to be another innovation. This year, however, there will be miles of beautiful gardens in addition to numerous displays of specimen blooms and gorgeous flower arrangements.

## Barrington Dogs Honored at Kennel Show in Chicago

Several Barrington dogs were winners in their respective classes at the 34th annual Chicago Kennel club show at the Columbus, Chicago, Saturday and Sunday. The show attracted nearly 1600 entrants, making the largest field of competitors in the history of the club. According to Alexander Stewart, of the Strathway Kennel in Barrington, who is president of the Kennel club, Mr. Stewart is well known as a breeder and trainer of dogs and has been president of the club for years.

Champion Keen Lady, a fox terrier, from Pasadena, Calif., was adjudged the best dog in the show but the following Barrington entries were honored:

Thomas M. Howell of Barrington township had his kennel represented by Martin Hogan who showed an Irish wolfhound of 26 months that was judged the best of his breed in the United States. Winning fawn of breed and best in class was awarded to Alexander Stewart, of the Strathway Kennel in Barrington, who is president of the Kennel club. Mr. Stewart is well known as a breeder and trainer of dogs and has been president of the club for years.

Mrs. Ruth B. Dawson entered her cocker spaniel, Barrington Black Buddy, in the limited class and was awarded the prize for the best of breed in the outdoor class.

This year the club staged a children's handling exhibition for the first time in the history of the show. Awards were made on the handling of dogs only, not on the merits of the dog shown. “Dorothy” Goes of Chicago won the prize cup for girls and Robert Mow, of Chicago took first prize for boys.
