The elder Osborn's specialty was also the 880 and in the last year of competition at Northwestern a 1:55 half-mile to finish second in that event at the Big Ten outdoor meet. "Ozzie" is a senior at B.H.S. and it is his goal to follow in his father's footsteps. It would seem to be a chance at beating his dad's mark, although a 1:55 half-mile is plenty fast.

With competition in the three local bowling leagues—District, Barrington, and Women's—over for the season, a check on the record books brings to light some rather interesting facts. Probably the high-light of the year was the spurt put on by the Pullman Dregs to win the Barrington league title. Miller Bros. led the circuit during most of the season with the Dregs usually in 3rd or 4th place. In the final weeks the Pullman team rallied, finally tying Miller Bros. on the final night, then winning the crown as a special roll-off. Pontiac-Hook and Arnold's Foods had comparatively easy times coping the District and Women's leagues respectively. For the third straight year Bill Stone, premier District pitcher topped the individuals in both leagues. This year he averaged 188 to narrowly beat out McCann who averaged 187. Last season Stone, who uses a slow ball to good advantage, led with a 195 average and was high in 1933 with a 192 record. Not to be overlooked was Frank Schroeder's 210 series, highest in either league for the last three years. Frank hit games of 255, 218, and 237 to turn the trick. John Caldwell's 680 series was second high.

Osborn Sets Half Mile Record at Lake County Meet

Runs 880 in 2:06.7; Half Second Under Old Mark; Deerfield Co. Champions

Ray Osborn, Barrington high's flashy half-miler set a new record in his favorite event to feature the ninth annual Lake county track and field meet held at Weism field, Waukegan, Tuesday afternoon. Osborn ran the 880 in 2 minutes 6.7 seconds, breaking the former mark set by Moran of Deerfield last year, by 15 of a second. Russell Ray of Libertyville came through with the only other new record as he broad jumped 89 feet 11 1/2 inches to supplant the old mark of 80 feet 6 1/2 inches set in 1932 by Vance Burnett of Libertyville and Orr Williams of Barrington.
