## School Orchestra Leaves for Music Meet at Madison

Will Represent State at National Tournament 11 a. m. Friday

Barrington high school orchestra, numbering thirty members, will leave for Madison, Wis., via a chartered bus Thursday afternoon to compete in the national orchestra and solo contests which will be held in the Masonic auditorium, Wisconsin avenue and Johnson street, Friday and Saturday. It will represent Illinois in the class C division of orchestra, having won first place in the state contest at Chicago, April 27. Miss Alvina Kocher, local high school pupil, will compete in the piano solo division as winner of the piano solo division of the state contest. She will play Saturday morning.

Barrington orchestra will play about 11 a. m. Friday, daylight saving time, according to W. N. Sears, local director, who stated that parents and friends of participants drive to Madison Friday morning in time to hear the local group and inspire them by applause. The Masonic auditorium will hold 22,000 persons, he said. About 4,000 school children will take part in the tournament. Central high school at Madison will serve as headquarters for all groups of contestants and all contestants will take place within a radius of one block from the school building. (The Masonic auditorium is directly across the street). Judges have not been announced.

Barrington will compete with nine orchestras from other states and class C division including schools with an enrollment of less than 250 pupils.

All contestants will be guests of the University of Wisconsin and will be given rooms and breakfast by the university. Supt. E. S. Smith, Mr. and Mrs. Sears and Mrs. E. Ott will accompany the local group.
