The history of Fox River Grove and Louis' Crystal Ballroom are as closely related as two strands in a braid according to a feature article published on the amusement page of the Chicago Daily News, June 4.

"Around the roadhouse sprang up a little settlement. The Chicago & North Western railroad built a station and trains began to stop there. And so the village of Fox River Grove was born."

"The restaurant expanded. In 1923 the Crystal Ballroom was built. This large, circular room set up in cabaret style, accommodated some 450 patrons on Saturday nights. Eight years ago the original frame structure was torn down and a new brick building took its place. This restaurant today is still a popular stopping place for motorists and Chicagoans who drive out in search of Bohemian pleasures."
