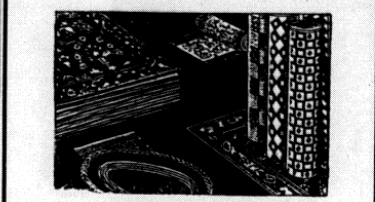
Rites of Civil War Days

Announces Competitive Examinations Now Open
The United States Civil Service Commission has announced open competitive examinations as follows:
Federal auditor, and senior and junior editorial editors, \$2200 a year, Foreign Service, Department of Agriculture, \$2300 a year, and assistant commercial inspector, \$2320 a year, Farm Credit Administration, \$2300 a year, except South Dakota, Iowa, Virginia, West Virginia, Maryland and the District have received less than their quota of appointments in the applicable geographical service in Washington, D. C.

Most Famous Book of John
