Economy Program for Lake County Effective Monday

County Attorney Starts Suits on Personal Taxes

Court proceedings to collect delinquent personal property taxes in Lake county were started Monday in the circuit court by the county attorney Charles E. Mason on behalf of the county. Persons owing large sums are to be tried first but every delinquent will be taken to court as the action progresses. Action goes as far back as 1930 in taxes on personal property.

Apportionment of \$4,950 Granted by Park Board Monday

An appropriation ordinance providing a total of \$4,950 to maintain and operate Barrington's two parks was passed by the local park board at its meeting Monday night. The following divisions were cited in the ordinance: buildings \$1500; lights \$250; sewage and drainage \$100; police \$100; grounds and equipment \$500; streets \$25; water \$150; salaries \$50; maintenance of grounds \$1250 and miscellaneous \$300.

Rental Rates for Proposed Sewers Discussed Monday

Discussion of the proposed sewer rental fees for the newly planned sewer was the chief topic of trustees at the board meeting Monday night. Trustee John Carver reported that his committee has been working on details and all differences are to be ironed out shortly.
