W. E. Heckert Dies Suddenly; Rites Held in Michigan

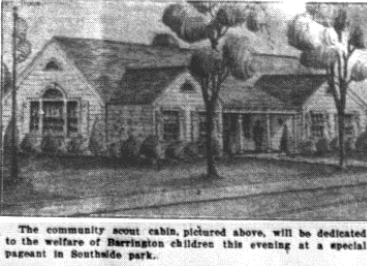
Funeral services were held in Hillsdale, Michigan, Saturday for Wesley E. Heckert, resident of Barrington for the past ten years.
