Water Reservoir, Main, Widening of Creek, Street Work in WPA! Requests Continued from page 1 leaks badly and needs a new roof. It is considered advisable to scrap the old reservoir and build a new one of 200,000 gallons capacity. This will then provide a capacity of 570,000 gallons which the village needs. In many streets in the village there are dead and water mains

between Spring and Summit streets, Harrison street between Main and Applebee streets, West Station street, between Dundee avenue and Lakeshore street, Lakeshore street between Russell street and Main street, George street between Main street and a point south, Dundee avenue between Hillside avenue and Russell street, Prairie avenue and Russell street, Prairie avenue and Russell street intersection to Northwest highway. The total cost of the above project to the WPA as estimated and proposed, is \$23,943, and to the village \$2883 or a combined total of \$26,755. Of this amount, \$18,560 is for labor, and \$8193 for material. The work is to be done in a period of 4 months and the estimated number of hours of
