Arlington Trims Warren 20 to 0 in First Start

Tenth Straight League Win for Arlington Over 3-Year Period

Arlington Heights, Northwest conference grid champ, made an impressive debut in defense of its 1934 title by trimming Warren 20-0 at Highline last Friday.

This victory marked the tenth straight conference win for Arlington over a three-year period. The Cardinals won their final three games in 1933 and capped six in a row last year.

"Swede" Johnson led Arlington to its decisive triumph over Warren, which was still minus the services of its injured backfield star, Brya.

Johnson made the first Heights touchdown on a plunge from the six-yard line near the end of the first quarter. Then in the second period he intercepted a Warren pass on his own 12 yard marker and galloped 63 yards to score. A Dearie in the third quarter accounted for the final Arlington touchdown on a plunge from the six-yard line. Koppala plunged successfully for two extra points.

A strong Cardinal defense kept the Warren running attack pretty well bottled up and the Blue Devils had to resort to passing for gains. Warren made 10 first downs to Arlington's nine.
