Hanover Farmer Commits Suicide Monday Afternoon

Insoberly, Beats Wife and Shoots Self Believing Her Dead

Tragedy moved through the home of a Hanover township farmer Monday afternoon, leaving one person dead, and leaving another sitting on the minds of daughter and mother the horror of a father and husband taking his own life in a moment of insanity while intoxicated.

Jacob Nubar, 43-year-old farmer living on U.S. Route 20 near town of Bartlett and Orlinville, south of Barrington, committed suicide Monday afternoon after beating his wife Maria while she was working in the basement of their farm home. Mrs. Nubar is located at an institution held by Dr. J. C. Corcoran B. Edinest in the Danieles and Willmaring funeral chapel, 203 S. Cook street.

Hosts Wife in Basement Mrs. Nubar related that her husband had been drinking in a tavern on the morning and also that he had consumed a half pint of whiskey shortly before noon. He began to become abusive during the hour. He went up stairs to sleep for awhile but returned shortly while his wife and daughter Lori

A large group attended the opening meeting of the Book Club last Thursday when Mrs. Lester Higgins gave a review of Ellen Glasgow's "Vein of Iron." It was an interesting and enjoyable review and gave the audience a keen desire to read the entire book. Mrs. Higgins stated that Miss Glasgow, who was born in Virginia, wrote continuously for some time. Her books have broken away from the old southern tradition, and reveal people as they are, not as they always have been pictured. Miss Glasgow now lives in Richmond, Va. "Vein of Iron" is beautifully written and the character sketches are exceptionally realistic. The story centers around Ada Fiskeville, taking her from childhood to middle age. Her father, upon losing his position as legislator, took his wife and child to live with his mother and sister in the Masses. They are all very poor with scarcely enough to eat and Ada's young life is full of disappointments. At twenty she is engaged to Ralph Morris, whom she deeply loves and has always felt belonged to her. Through trickery he is forced into marriage with another girl. There follow a number of unhappy years when they separate and then through the terrible day the war they spend several days together. Though they hoped to be married before he sailed, his divorce was not final until he was on his way across. Ada never regrets her actions, though shortly after her child is born her husband dies, which deepens her grief as she feels partly responsible. Upon Ralph's return from the war they are married and taking Ada's father and aunt move to a larger city. The story carries them through the boom years following the war with all of them drawing large salaries and then through the terrible crash in October, 1929 when many of their neighbors and friends are left penniless and they themselves are nearly destitute. At the death of Mr. Fiskeville, Ada finally decides to again live in the old Masses in Ironside and fix it up so it may go down to their son and his children.

The book brings out Ada's great love for Ralph, her deep capacity for enjoying life even when she was unhappy, and her ability to which was handed down from her ancestors, hardy pioneers in that country.
