**H.C. Paddock, 83, Prominent Editor at Heights, Dies**

Funeral Services Held Sunday for Veteran Newspaper Publisher

H.C. Paddock, editor of the Barrington Herald and associate publisher, died Friday morning, Nov. 13, after an illness of 28 days due to heart failure. His death due to heart failure and infirmities of old age came quite while he slept.

Funeral was held Sunday afternoon in the Presbyterian church at Arlington Heights. The Rev. A. Kework conducted the services. Pall bearers were the wife and grandsons of the deceased.

Cornish Paddock was born in Western, Oneida county, New York, August 5, 1852. He studied for a teacher's department and a certificate. He was writing as principal of a school at Montrose, Mr. Paddock married Miss Janetie Paddock, all of whom are living.

Mr. and Mrs. Paddock settled at Peaslee, where they conducted a private school, later moving to Peaslee. Securing a position with Hard McNally & Co., they moved to Chicago. Mr. Paddock took up teaching. He owned and operated the Wheaton Illinois, Peaslee, Waukegan, Elmhurst and Lake County Independent. He owned and operated the Peaslee Enterprise and the following year he acquired the Peaslee Herald at Arlington Heights. He moved to the Peaslee in 1907, where for 28 years he conducted the paper. He was an active member of the Peaslee Post No. 1474, G. A. R. and the Peaslee Post No. 1474, G. A. R. He remained six children: Stella, Lucile, Charles, Lucile, Mrs. M. P. Daniels, of Peaslee, Ill., and Mrs. E. M. Adams, of Swarthmore, Pa., and of San Francisco.

**Local Individuals Named in \$30,000 Civil Damage Suit**

Civil suit for \$30,000 on two counts was filed in the superior court of Cook county against John Toman, sheriff of Cook county, United States Fidelity and Guaranty company, Charles Elsner and Paul Magnuson of Barrington. Plaintiffs in the case are Bert and Emma Beckman. Mr. and Mrs. Beckman were former residents on a farm south of Barrington but now live in the village.

The two counts claim an illegal dispossession, loss of valuable goods, filing of bankruptcy and loss of equity on notes on a farm under a trust deed.

Sheriff Toman is alleged to have

lost and damaged personal property in act of dispossession the plaintiff, as tenants. The United States Fidelity and Guaranty company, a bonding company for Mr. Toman under Illinois statute, is named as liable for damages resulting from these alleged losses. Charles Elsner is named as receiver of property and as an individual. Paul Magnuson is named as cooperating in plan to dispossess Beckman and gain possession of the farm.

The plaintiffs claim that they were tenants of a farm on which they held equity by notes and that they rented the farm from the daily appointed receiver by verbal lease. They state that efforts to pay rent to the receiver were not accepted.

During the dispossession period they claim they were forced into bankruptcy by acts of the individuals and receiver. They also claim that efforts were made to gain control of the farm for sale to an individual or individuals unknown to the plaintiff.

The plaintiffs are represented by the Taylor, Cattone, Partidge and Parker law firm of Chicago. Hearing of the case is not expected before next fall.
