CLASS LEGISLATION
While unemployment and old age insurance legislation is popular with the majority of the citizens, the fact that the unemployment plan passed by the Illinois house is decidedly class and discriminatory legislation, and as such is very unfair, will eventually be realized by many socially magnificent souls who now approve it.

While the taxes which are contemplated by this legislation are levied upon payrolls of employers and workers and collected from employers, employers of Illinois will not be able to assume the responsibility of the huge burden of these taxes. This tax burden will accordingly be shifted to the consumer of goods just as the Illinois sales tax burden is shifted to the consumer. The tax will be found in the price the consumer pays for what he uses—in effect another consumer's tax.

The steady worker, the farmer, the farm worker, the domestic servant, the public servant, the independent worker or operator in any trade, profession, business or service—and the employee of the small employer—none of them can receive a cent from the money raised by the taxes collected under this program, but each as a consumer of goods, will bear his tax burden just as surely as he bears the Illinois sales tax burden today.

DO YOU KNOW ILLINOIS?
