Local Five Plays an Improved Game; Ponies Win 20 to 14

North Leads Scoring; BHS Teams Play at Leyden Friday

The famous Leyden Drury Lane theater district back to 1903, when the first theater of this name was opened, on the site of a riding yard, at that time in an aristocratic quarter of the city. It was then called the Theater Royal and the first play produced was Beaumont and Fletcher's "The Humorous Lieutenant." Nell Wynne made her first appearance in 1903 and two years later, the first theater two years later, the first building burned down in 1907 and was succeeded by the present one. The theater was destroyed by fire in 1910, this lasted until 1931 when it was torn down. The third one burned down in 1930 and the fourth and present one was opened in 1932. Drury Lane's history is practically the history of the English stage for the past three centuries and is connected with such names as Mrs. Siddons, Garrick, Kemble, Kean, Sheridan and Mrs. Norton. John Howard Payne played Nerval there in "Douglas" in 1813 and may have been one of the first American actors to play there; he never married.
