State School Aid Small; Senate's Hearing Reveals

Hearings of the United States senate committee on education, just published, reveal that Illinois ranks at the bottom of the list in rates of state and local government as compared to private income. According to this report, Illinois' state and local taxes are 7.1 percent of the private income of the state. This is the lowest of 48 states. In California the rate is 11.2, in Delaware 12.0, and in New York 12.1. This comparison was made for the year 1930. This is the first time Illinois has been placed lowest in comparison of taxes as compared to ability to pay taxes. The "Tax Magazine" for December, 1934, ranked Illinois 45th in the ratio of state and local taxation to taxable wealth.

Other studies reported in the hearings of the senate educational committee ranked Illinois low in effort to support schools. Newcomer's study, according to the hearing, indicates that Illinois is 39th in percent of estimated tax resources expended by state and local governments for public schools. Chalm's study, on a slightly different basis, ranks Illinois 48th on effort by state and local governments to support education. Using a basis as 100 for the average effort of all states to support schools, Illinois is ranked 89.4 percent, Michigan 131.7, Indiana 102.9, Michigan 126.9, New York 115.8, Texas 104.2, and Wisconsin 102.1.

While the combined efforts of state and local governments to support the public schools in Illinois rank low as compared to the ability of the state, the local governments in many cases are extending themselves to the limit to provide good schools for their children. In fact, 90 percent of our school support comes from the local districts, the state supplying only 10 percent. Strenuous local efforts, as indicated by high tax rates, are not sufficient to provide an adequate education for the children of many districts. The small amount of support from the state government causes large educational inequalities and places a heavy load on the taxing unit.
