

Sewer Gas Fatal to J.J. Bohman of Fox River Grove

Enters Manhole to Kill a
Snake and Is
Asphyxiated

Entering a manhole to kill a snake which had delayed sewer workers near the old Fox hotel in Fox River Grove proved fatal to Joseph J. Bohman, 57, Monday afternoon. Mr. Bohman, who had been police marshal of the village for the past 15 years, was asphyxiated by deadly gas which had accumulated in the bottom of the pit.

He had started down a ladder to the pit, intending to shoot the snake. About half way down, he was overcome by the gas and toppled to the bottom, falling in a few inches of water.

Two would-be rescuers were almost asphyxiated also. William Rivis and another man whose name was not obtained, started down the manhole after they saw him fall but both were affected by the gas, became dizzy and managed to get back to the street only to lose consciousness there.

It was necessary for officials to blow out gas fumes from the pit before the body of Mr. Bohman could be removed.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Jennie Bohman; two sons, Edwin and Orville; three daughters, Mrs. Bonita Lowe, Miss Ruth Bohman and Miss Marion Bohman; and his mother, Mrs. Barbara Bohman.

Funeral services will be held at 2 Thursday afternoon at his residence in Fox River Grove and burial will be at Cary.

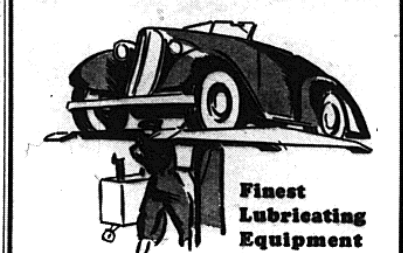
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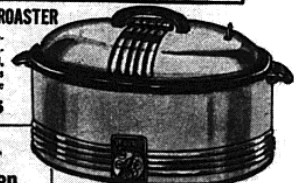
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
