VILLAGE OF LAKE BARRINGTON MINUTES OF THE REGULARLY SCHEDULED MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES HELD OCTOBER 7, 2008

1. CALL TO ORDER

A regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Lake Barrington was held at the Village Municipal Center, 23860 Old Barrington Road, on Tuesday, October 7, 2008, and was called to order by President Pro Tem Vonder Haar at 7:00 p.m. Loretta Peterson was appointed Recording Secretary.

4. CONSIDERATION OF MINUTES

A. Minutes of the Regular Meeting Held September 2, 2008

Board Action

A motion was made by Trustee Schaller and seconded by Trustee DeJesu to approve the minutes, item 4 A above. The voice vote was unanimous and the motion carried.

5. PRESIDENT'S REMARKS

A. Slocum Lake Drainage District – Presentation - CD ROM Provided in Board Folder

Don Krebs, resident of Twin Pond Farms and Chairperson of the Slocum Lake Drainage District, indicated Mike Warner was present to assist him with the presentation only and not as a representative of Lake County Stormwater Management. Mr. Krebs gave a slide show presentation on Slocum Lake Drainage Branch A in the Lake Barrington area which included aerial photography referencing the location of the drainage ditch, a historical and current perspective of the flow routes, two blockages and their effects on adjacent properties within the Village as well as proposed maintenance for Branch A. A cost breakdown was presented indicating total initial maintenance would be \$150,420 and subsequent annual maintenance would be \$7,521. He proposed a plan to annex Lakeland Estates residents into the drainage

district and to enter into an intergovernmental agreement with the Village that would dedicate tax assessments from Lake Barrington residents towards returning Branch. A to a maintainable condition. He is working with Wauconda Township on a plan to clear the ditch within its own boundaries and noted the work is included in the total cost. Mr. Krebs asked for direction on how to address jurisdictional issues and funding. Mr. Martin requested a draft intergovernmental agreement. Mr. Krebs noted there will be two agreements, an agreement dedicating district revenues from Lake Barrington residents towards Branch A and an agreement between jurisdictions for maintenance.

6. OPPORTUNITY FOR THE PUBLIC TO ADDRESS THE VILLAGE BOARD

Wendy Conroy, a resident of Kelsey Farm Subdivision addressed the Board regarding a need for a street light to illuminate the corner of Kelsey Road and Dublin Way for safety reasons. She explained it is the bus stop for the subdivision and the transportation company will not move the bus stop. The light would also enhance safety for drivers who are turning into the subdivision or using the run-around lane.

Angela Krzysko, a resident of Kelsey Farm subdivision, distributed and read a letter written by a student from the subdivision that was sent to President Richardson in 2006. The letter expressed the need for a street light at the corner of Kelsey Road and Dublin Way to enhance safety for students and residents.

Martha Boling-Risser, a resident of Kelsey Farm subdivision, stated she has 4 children whose safety is at risk, because the intersection is not illuminated for students.

President Pro Tem Vonder Haar moved Agenda Item 14B: Consideration of Installation of a Street Lamp at Kelsey Road and Dublin Way up on agenda.

- A: Resolution No. 2008-R-29, a Resolution for the Estimate of the Amount of a Tax Levy in Compliance with the Requirements of the Truth in Taxation Act: The tax levy is being increased by 5% or \$19,000 from last year. The \$363,000 tax levy will cover the costs for waste disposal, mosquito abatement and a portion of budgeted consulting fees.

13. ORDINANCES

A. CONSIDERATION OF AN ORDINANCE: PROHIBITED TRUCK WEIGHT LIMIT

Mr. Martin reported staff received a request from the Lake County Sheriff's Department to adjust the prohibited truck weight limit to better match enforcement efforts and actual truck weights. The adjustment lowers the prohibited weight from 12,001 to 8,001 on Alice Lane and Anderson Road.

It was confirmed the ordinance applies to gross weight and that certain trucks, such as garbage trucks and moving vans, are exempt.

14. NEW BUSINESS

A. EMERGENCY OPERATIONS PLAN: PRESENTATION & DISCUSSION

Mr. Martin reported the Public Safety Committee developed a draft Emergency Operations Plan (EOP) to establish an emergency management strategy capable of operation in any type of disaster situation whether natural or technological. The EOP defines roles, sets procedures, and provides other information for implementation while recognizing the Village's unique operating environment of depending on the

services of other public safety entities for first response. He highlighted elements of the plan and noted the plan has been sent to first responders for comment. He proposed a table read with the board, staff and area first responders to role play an emergency situation after the report is finalized. It was suggested emergency operation plans for other entities within the Village, such as Lake Barrington Shores, be included as an addendum to the Village EOP. The draft report was provided in the Board folder.

Board Action

The Board reached consensus to direct staff to continue to review and finalize the Village of Lake Barrington Emergency Operations Plan

B. CONSIDERATION OF EXTENDING A LETTER OF CREDIT – FOLEY/JKF SUBDIVISION

Mr. Martin explained the deadline for subdivision improvements to the JKF Subdivision was September 15th. The improvements have not been completed to date. Due to market conditions the developer has requested an extension of the letter of credit. The developer's bank will extend the Letter of Credit to April 15, 2009. Materials are provided in the Board folder.

Board Action

A motion was made by Trustee DeJesu and seconded by Trustee Raclaw to pass Resolution No. 2008-R-30, a Resolution extending a Letter of Credit re: JKF Subdivision.

C. CONSIDERATION OF INSTALLATION OF A STREET LAMP AT KELSEY ROAD AND DUBLIN WAY

This item was discussed following Item 6 – Opportunity for the Public to Address the Village Board

Mr. Martin explained the Village received a request from the Kelsey Farms Homeowners Association for a street light to be located on Kelsey Road at Dublin Way (the entrance to the subdivision). There is a "run-around" lane at this location for north-bound vehicles on Kelsey Road and residents are reporting a dangerous condition due to the volume (10,600 ADT), and speed of traffic accelerating from the signal at Route 22 and Kelsey Road. The location of the street lamp on the east side of Kelsey Road at Dublin Way would resolve several public safety issues by illuminating the run-around lane, bus stop and entrance. The Village would install a more decorative pole and lamp to set a precedent for Pepper Road and future street lights. The cost at this time would be born entirely by the Village; however, a request has been made for a cost share via Lake

County. The estimated cost is \$25,000, \$10,000 was budgeted, however, funds are available to complete the project. Materials were provided in the Board folder.

Trustee DeJesu asked if the homeowners' associations paid for street lights at their respective entrances. Mr. Martin reported that he could only speculate that the other lights on Kelsey Road were installed by Lake County or the original developer.

Trustee Schaller suggested installing a regular pole and light and to save the decorative fixture for the future. He also noted Lake Barrington Shores (LBS) entrances are well-lit and that LBS paid for their fixtures. He expressed concern that installing a decorative fixture will set a precedent.

Trustee Burke inquired if the proposed location is the most appropriate and what the incremental cost is between to the two types of fixtures. He also summarized the three main issues are: need, appropriate location, and whether or not to install a decorative fixture. Mr. Martin indicated the incremental cost between a standard pole and lamp versus a decorative fixture is likely \$2,500 to \$3,000 but that staff would have to review that cost.

Trustee Raclaw affirmed LBS paid for its own entrance street lights, that there is a need for a light at the proposed intersection, a conventional light is acceptable but he needs a recommendation on an appropriate location.

Trustee Struck agrees a light is needed and favors a decorative fixture as it follows the objectives detailed in the comprehensive plan regarding local roadway enhancements. He would also like a recommendation on the appropriate location.

Discussion was held on the need, appropriate location of the street lamp, incremental cost of a basic pole and light versus a decorative fixture, the precedence installing a decorative light fixture would set for other neighborhoods that requested a street lamp in the future, costs for maintenance and installation of the street lamp by type and location, and funding alternatives through cost sharing with the neighborhood and/or the county. Resident Angela Krzysko asked who pays for the maintenance on other Kelsey Road lights. Mr. Martin replied that either ComEd or Lake County provides maintenance and the Village pays for the power. A Kelsey Farms resident suggested that with current advanced technology the village investigate different types of lighting that may be lower maintenance. Mr. Martin suggested to the Board that the item be tabled to allow staff to review with the Village Engineer the incremental costs associated with alternate poles and fixtures and undergrounding the cable to the east side of Kelsey Road. Staff would also clarify if Lake County and any interest in costsharing and provide a photometric analysis of the lighting of the run around and best location of the lamp for that purpose.

Pro Tem Vonder Haar summarized the board agreed there is a need to illuminate the intersection, that the board needed more information before deciding on the type and location of the light fixture and suggested tabling the item until the next meeting.

A motion was made by Trustee Burke and seconded by Trustee Schaller to table this agenda item until the next meeting.

This year, the Village is permitting Trick or Treating on Friday, October 31st from 4 pm to 8 pm. It was noted the hours proposed are different than previous years because Halloween is on a Friday.

Board Action

A motion was made by Trustee Struck and seconded by Trustee Raclaw to pass Resolution No. 2008-R-31, a Resolution regarding Trick or Treat Hours in the Village of Lake Barrington. The voice vote was unanimous and the motion carried.
